

## Ballinamore Seán O'Heslin's Le Seán Ó Súilleabháin



Ballinamore Seán O'Heslin's hold a central place in the story of Leitrim GAA. Tá cáil ar an gclub, ní hamháin i Liatroim, ach ar fud na tire. The club is the most successful in Leitrim in terms of titles won. O'Heslin's have won 20 Senior Championships and 24 Minor Championships have come to the town. The club consistently fields in all grades in hurling and football.

The club was founded in on 31 January 1889 at a meeting in McGauran's Railway Hotel, now the Allied Irish Bank. Sean

O'Heslin, a teacher in Ballinamore, who was a native of Aughawillan, was the driving force behind the club in its most successful period, the 1930's. Fuair sé bás i 1942, nuair nach raibh ach 55 bliain slánaithe aige. The club was named after him in 1953.

#### **Successful Teams**

Seán O'Heslin's have been highly successful in every grade of football and hurling. The club contested the first ever Leitrim Senior Championship in 1890 and reached the final, but lost to Mohill. Twenty-three years later, in 1913, they won their first senior championship. The greatest periods in the club's history were in the 1930's; when five senior titles were won, and then a prolonged period of success from 1964 to 1990, when twelve senior titles came to the club. Probably the club's greatest achievement was a three-in-a-row of senior titles between 1967-1969. Ironically, the club has never won an Intermediate Championship, and this is only their fifth time to take part in the Intermediate grade, the other years being 2002, 2013, 2014 and 2015. In three of the other four occasions they were beaten in the final.

#### Scór

Sean O'Heslin's are one of the most successful clubs in the country in terms of Scór. They have a proud record of success in Leitrim a well as in Connacht. Tá naoi Craobh na hÉireann buaite acu i Scór Sinsear agus cúig cinn i Scór na nÓg.

#### Pitch

In 1952, Páirc Sheáin Uí Eislin was opened, the first GAA grounds in Leitrim. It was the centre for county games of all sorts until Páirc Seán Mac Diarmada opened in Carrick-on-Shannon in 1964. It continued to host smaller county fixtures until it fell into disrepair in the 1990's. The club carried out major developments at the site and two excellent pitches were developed and a new stand/dressing-rooms were erected in the 2000's. D'oscail Uachtarán CLG, Críostóir Ó Cuana na háiseanna seo ar an 24 Bealtaine 2009.





## **Drumkeeran Club History**



Brian Hoare NT of Knockcroghery, a former Roscommon footballer and a teacher in Allenview National School organised the first Drumkeeran Gaelic football team of the modern era. Drumkeeran took part in the North Leitrim League when teams played for the "London Cup". The club's first game, on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1933, was played in Buchannan's Field which lies between the Dowra road and the Old road

and resulted in a defeat to a Ballinaglera team. The Club flourished throughout the thirties with Pat Christy, Larry Christy, Myles Christy, Pete Gilroy, Shane Corristine, Johnny McLoughlin, Hughie Mc Morrow, Tommy Gilhooley, Eddie McPartland, Tommy Guihan, Mike Higgins continuing the tradition initiated by Brian Hoare in 1933. With funds at premium, dances, suppers and sports days yielded the vast majority of the funds to run the club and buy football boots. A match was usually played in conjunction with the sports and a dance finished off the days activities. Incidentally the first jerseys worn by the 30's players were blue and yellow.

Jack Walsh NT, Seamus Duignan, Patrick Forde, Tom Beirne, Paddy Kelly, Sonny Crown and Jim Gallagher facilitated the transition of Drumkeeran football from the early years into the fifties and sixties. Fr. Seamus Duffy, a Meath native, was instrumental in acquiring a field on the Manorhamilton road, where all games, up to the purchase of the present pitch, were played. The Fr. Duffy era was significant for the advance in Drumkeeran's football fortunes but was also was a time of appalling emigration when whole families sold out and left the country. Most promising players in the area were lost. Before Fr. Duffy left in 1961, efforts were made to hold the club together and the formation of a minor team which at a stage amalgamated with Drumshanbo. This minor team bridged the gap between the fifties and the era of the early sixties. The club was revived in 1963 on the arrival of a Cavan man, Eamonn O'Grady who was the driving force of the club for many years. In 1964 Drumkeeran lost to Annaduff in the JFC Final, however in 1966 the title was claimed by defeating Mohill. The JFL was won in 1967 when Fenagh did not play the final, and in 1969 the club reached the semi-finals of the SFC, losing out to Melvin Gaels. Curiously enough the club lapsed in 1973 despite having won MFL titles in 1970 &'71, and a JFL title in '71. The club was reorganised in October 1973 under the leadership of Chairman Charlie Flynn, Secretary Andy Redican, and Treasurer Tony Forde R.I.P. The club was defeated by Aughawillan in the 1974 JFC Final but in 1975 made amends winning the League and Championship double defeating Eslin. In 1975, Shamrock Gaels amalgamation of Dromahair, Drumkeeran and Drumshanbo won the MFC Title. 1981 brought further success winning the JFL. In 1983 the club completed the purchase of a new club ground which was negotiated by Clare native Michael Hanley R.I.P. who was club Chairman. In 1985 the JFC title was won. Drumkeeran enjoyed a very successful 1980's at underage level and in October 1986 Drumkeeran and Dromahair played an U14 Challenge game in Croke Park. In 1988 Andy Redican won the Leitrim Clubman of the Year award. The 1990's saw continued success at underage level. Pairc Naomh Bride was officially opened in May 1993 with Derry and Leitrim playing a Senior Challenge. In 1992 & 2000 the club lost to Melvin Gaels & St Mary's in the IFC finals. The club reached the SFC B Championship final in 2004 losing out to Glencar/Manor.

In 2005 our Junior team captured the Division 3 League. In 2006, 2013 and 2015 the U21's won the 13 aside Championship. In 2007 the ACL D3 title was captured and the U21's reached the A FC Final. The club reachedthe IFC finals of 2008 and 2010 losing out to Aughnasheelin and Aughawillian. The ladies teams have been very competitive at both juvenile and adult levels winning the Junior double in 2013 and have contested the IFC Finals of 2015 and 2016. Underage success continues to date in the club which caters from under 6's to adult grades for both boys and girls.

The club's facilities are constantly improving and there are ongoing plans for future development. The Handball Club facilities are excellent with the indoor Court & Gym at Pairc Naomh Brid. From this brief history we have a Proud Parish and Club tradition with Gaels past and present. Here's hoping we add another happy chapter to our club's history today. *Droim Caorthainn Abú*.



## Glencar Manorhamilton Joint Captains James Glancy & Brian McDonald



James Glancy showed great promise from his juvenile days and his prowess continued into the Minor Grade. This now 34 year old player was then drafted into the Leitrim Minor and U21 sides and joined the Senior Panel in 2003. While a student in Sligo IT James, a gifted forward, was proud to be part of the Sigerson and Ryan Cup winning teams in 2005. His prowess with Leitrim in championship and league saw him selected on the Connacht Inter-Provincial teams in 2006 & 2008 and elected as county team captain in 2011. A victory that means much to James was Leitrim's Connacht Junior Championship win in 2004 and he is justly proud of his provincial medal. After an eleven year campaign on the Leitrim senior side, James decided to retire from inter-county action but is still an important cog in his club's forward line. Previously employed as a Games Promotion Officer with Dublin GAA, James has recently become a GPO with Leitrim GAA and no doubt the youth of the county

will benefit greatly from his coaching and expertise.

Brian McDonald, like his fellow captain, is a very versatile and adaptable player. It is said that a good footballer can play anywhere and this is certainly true of Bruno, who lines out in the forwards today, but who has previously starred at midfield and also at centre half back. This 32 year old Logistics Administrator is noted for his bursts of speed and jinking solo-runs, together with his accuracy from play and from frees. Brian enjoyed a very successful underage career and had the distinction of lining out with Leitrim at Minor and U21 level before being called into the Senior panel and becoming a regular in the green and gold. His career was interrupted somewhat by injury but he bounced back to continue to star at county and club level. He is proud to have captained Glencar Manorhamilton in 2011 when the club won four-in-a-row Leitrim Senior Championships and to be lining out today along-side his equally talented brothers Anthony and Thomas. While the Joint Captains acknowledge that winning the title depends very much on a full team performance, with their skill, influence and leadership James Glancy and Brian McDonald will certainly be pulling the strings

#### **Glencar Manorhamilton Management**

The smile on *Aidan Rooney's* face told it all. He was lining up to take the last free of the game, but he knew that, for once, it didn't matter if he scored. Leitrim were just seconds away from the Connacht Championship title of 1994. The kick and then the 67 year wait was over and Aidan and his team mates were swamped by ecstatic Leitrim followers in some of the most memorable ever scenes following a Connacht final.

That day would certainly be the highlight of Aidan's 14 year career in the Leitrim senior jersey, but he had also been a real star with the county minor and U21 sides. A prolific scoring forward, Aidan's style and accuracy was very reminiscent of those of his uncles Micheál and James

Kearins of Sligo, who were part of the side that won the 1975 Connacht Final for the Yeats County.

In 1999 Aidan won a Leitrim Senior Championship title alongside his younger brother, the late Mark Rooney. Both gave tremendous service to the club, of which their father, Francie, was a prominent official, serving time as Chairperson and Selector, while also being a Selector with the Leitrim Minor side of 1998 that won the Connacht title.

After moving to Sligo, Aidan became a vital part of the St Mary's club as a player and coach for a number of years. In 2013 and 2014 he was manager of the Sligo Minor team that won the Connacht Minor League and only lost the Connacht Minor Championship Final after a replay.

This year Aidan is back with his home club Glencar Manorhamilton and has led them to today's final, in which they meet Aughawillan, a club Aidan lined out against on many occasions, as well as being part of the Leitrim team with a number of Aughawillan players. Memories of Leitrim GAA followers will always connect Aidan with his days as a Leitrim star, winning the All Ireland B Championship in 1990 and that historic Connacht title of 1994. But today the Glencar Manorhamilton fans will be hoping he will make a very special contribution to the club's championship record.

*John Sheridan* is Aidan Rooney's right hand man on the Glencar Manorhamilton sideline today. Though he is in his first year as a senior selector John is far from being a novice in the training and selection of teams. For many years he has given sterling service to the club as a coach, trainer and manager of juvenile teams from U10 up to Minor level, while also lending his skills to the Leitrim underage Development Squads. His cool temperament and decision making will be a great benefit to Manager Aidan Rooney and the Glencar Manorhamilton players.





Aughawillan GAA Club can proudly trace it's football heritage right back to 1889, when the first County Board in Leitrim was established and Lower Drumreilly as it was then known, took part as one of twenty four teams in the first County Championship in Leitrim in 1890. Aughawillan GAA grounds are based in Stroke and the club draws members from the parishes of Corraleehan and Aughawillan.

The Aughawillan Senior team between 1980 and 1994 had a golden era which very few clubs can match in terms of success.

In those 15 years the senior team were in 13 consecutive league finals from 1980 to 1992 losing eight and winning five. They appeared in ten Senior Championship finals winning in 1983,1984,1989 and winning three in a row in 1992;1993 and 1994. They also reached two Senior Connacht Club Finals in 1992 and 1994.

In 2014 Aughawillan again rose to great heights as they won the Senior County Championship title and continued this success reaching the semi-final of the Connacht Club Championship. Aughawillan has won ten Senior County Championships in 1923, 1976, 1978, 1983, 1984, 1989, 1992, 1993, 1994 and 2014.

Aughawillan as a small rural club with dwindling numbers in the Community were forced to amalgamate at underage with neighbouring parishes in order to ensure that football was sustained and has seen success with the Leitrim Minor Champions in 2007 and 2008 as Garadice Gaels, U21 County winners in 2013 and 2015 as St Brigid's & U16 Champions in 2013 as St Brigid's. A noteworthy feature of Aughawillan GAA Club is the continued hard work and perseverance of underage mentors to ensure that the club is kept alive with young blood learning the traditions of the GAA and pride in one's team, club and area.

Aughawillan GAA grounds have continued to be developed through the years and the community can be proud of the new Dressing Rooms, Gym, Club rooms, Training Pitch and most recently a Handball Court which have been added to our football club. These improvements have kept the community striving towards a GAA club that is modern and welcoming to all.

In 2016, we now have a team of talented and determined young men who are unwavering in their wish to mark their page in the history books of Leitrim Senior Football Championship titles. We wish them continued success and wish to thank our community at home and abroad who have supported Aughawillan GAA throughout the years.

County Final is a day like no other in the Leitrim GAA calendar. Every club player devotes themselves to reaching County Final day at the beginning of each year but for the vast majority, it is from the sidelines that they experience County Final day as very few get to savour the unique atmosphere of the biggest day in the club calendar.

Supporters get to the ground just that little bit earlier to savour the build-up, get the best seats in the ground or at least ensure that their favourite spot is still there. Fans arrive in Pairc Sean who mightn't

have seen their team in action all year but, drawn from wherever they may be in exile all over the country, the lure of the big day is impossible to resist.

Even more to the point, the day of the County Senior Final is special as it is a day when the Gaels of Leitrim will descend on Pairc Sean Mac Diarmada to see the top two teams battle it out for the title of Leitrim's best. They will come from Kinlough to Gortletteragh, Carrigallen to Dromahair and everywhere else in between as favourites will be picked, tactics discussed by the cognoscenti of Leitrim football.

For the clubs involved, County Final day is the culmination of what seems like a marathon build-up. As Colin Regan put it in his column in this week's Observer - "The worlds of the two clubs involved shifts on their axis a little and everything else in their universe moves a little further away from both the sun and the moon."

For the players of Aughawillan and Glencar/Manorhamilton, County Final day is a serious business, made all the more so by the fact that they have tasted success before but disappointment since then. You can be sure that it is not the victories of 2014 and 2011 that is driving on both camps on Sunday but the soul-destroying losses of 2015.

For Ballinamore Sean O'Heslin's and Drumkeerin, the day is no less nerve-wracking as both have suffered defeat on the big day and you can be sure that Drumkeerin's losses to Aughawillan and Aughnasheelin in the past still rankle just as much as the defeats in the last two Finals hurt in Ballinamore.

But sometimes looking at what could go wrong obscures just what could go right and it is worrying trend, particularly at inter-county level, that teams set out not to lose rather than attempting to win - it might pedantic but in that distinction, there is a world of difference in the mindset of players & management and it often reveals itself under the greatest of pressure.

Sunday's County Final is also a big day for the young footballers of Melvin Gaels and St. Manchan's who contest the Minor A Final. It is the premier underage title in the county but it is also a reminder to young players subject to many pressures, social and sporting, that the challenge is only just beginning when they look at the Senior and Intermediate Finals.

Yet I have to say that I'm delighted to see the Intermediate Final back on the same bill as the Senior Final. County Final day is the ultimate celebration of the club in Leitrim and that means adult club footballers taking priority and enjoying their moment in the limelight.

County Final day is the biggest and most intense day of the year and long may that continue.

#### **Remembering Mark**



At today's County Senior Final, the Glencar Manorhamilton club and the Gaels of Leitrim remember in a very special way Mark Rooney who died on 17 September 2016.

Mark won a senior title with Glencar Manor in 1999 and again in 2009 when he was both a player and selector. This sporting great will live long in the memory of all who knew him. In jothlainn De go raibh se.

#### Frank Heavey - Outstanding Ballinamore and Leitrim player

Frank Heavey, one of the greatest footballers to don the Ballinamore Sean O'Heslin's jersey died suddenly in New York in March of this year at the age of 57. Ironically, Frank was born in England and only came into contact with Gaelic football when his family returned to live in Ballinamore.

Frank won three senior football championships with the Ballinamore club. His first was in 1982 and he captained the winning side in 1986. He was working in America in 1988 and missed the club's successful run in the championship, but he returned to play in the final against Aughawillan in 1990 and won his third medal. In that game he played a starring role at centre half forward. During the years from 1982 to 1990, there was intense rivalry between the neighbouring clubs; Sean O'Heslin's and Aughawillan. In this period, they met in five county finals with the spoils fairly evenly divided; O'Heslin's won three and Aughawillan won two. Frank was a pivotal player in those games.

His displays for Seán O'Heslin's gained him a place on the Leitrim team in the early 1980's and he would have been on the team longer, had he not emigrated to America in 1987.

Frank was buried in New York but a memorial mass in his honour was celebrated in Ballinamore Church on 9 April last. This was attended by an overflow congregation, including many of his former footballing adversaries from Aughawillan and Gortletteragh and indeed from the whole county. This was an indication of the high esteem in which he was held, by all who played with him and against him. Tributes were paid to him from the altar by his brother Jimmy, Gerry Logan and others. He was an outstanding footballer and a gentleman both on and off the field. Peileadóir den chead scoth. Suaimhneas síoraí do.

In April 1962, a group of people from around Carrick on Shannon dreamed up the idea of having a county GAA pitch in the town. The prime movers in that group were George O'Toole and Fr Pat Claffey C.C, a native of Athlone. Canon Michael Kearney, the parish priest, was also very much involved. Seán Mullarkey who worked in the Post Office was Secretary. Others involved with the development were; Danny Mitchell, Tomás Ó Riordáin, Pat O'Loan, Joe Moran, Bernie Macken, Jim Scott and Kevin Doherty, all now "ar shlí na firinne". There are two others, still living, who were involved; Jimmy Stenson from Carrick on Shannon and Eddie McMahon, who now lives in Monaghan.

The committee used meet in the curate's house, which was right beside the church and Jimmy Stenson remembers the decision being made at a meeting there to name the Park after Leitrim's patriot, Seán Mac Diarmada.

Fifty-two years ago, Páirc Sheáin Mhic Dhiarmada was officially opened. On Sunday 24 May 1964, Uachtarán Cumann Lúthchleas Gael, Alf Ó Muirí from Armagh performed the official opening.

Leitrim footballer. The dressing rooms had not
been constructed at the time and the teams
togged out in the old County Hotel. The cost
of the work to opening day was £8,000 and

a huge crowd of 8,000 people attended the

opening. The Leitrim match was refereed by Paddy Mulvey from the Roscommon side

of Carrick on Shannon. The Leitrim team on that famous day was: Paudge McGowan
