

GROUND REGULATIONS Avantcard Páirc Seán MacDiarmada

All persons entering this ground are admitted only subject to the following Ground Regulations and the Rules and Regulations of Coiste Chontae Liatroma. Entry to the ground shall be deemed to constitute unqualified acceptance of all these Rules and Regulations.



Ryan Crawford and Padraig Clarke Joint Team Captains



Ryan Crawford is aged 23 and works as an agricultural contractor. He generally plays at half back and is very solid, strong and fit. His is the first name on the team sheet. Ryan is one of four brothers who play for the club with his eldest brother **John** playing alongside him today.

Padraig Clarke is aged 25 and is employed as a plumber. He is a leader on and off the pitch, evasive and strong with a great tackling technique. He will be joined today by his brother Gerard while his sister Annette serves as the team medic.

JP Kane (Bainisteoir)

A native of Gortletteragh, JP lives in Fenagh. He is married to Aoife and has four children. He works as a blocklayer. He has extensive experience in training men and ladies football in Leitrim and north Longford. This is his first year with Ballinaglera and under his enthusiastic management the team has made great strides. He played as a full forward for his club.

Roghnóirí:

Adrian McGourty

A long time servant of the club he played his football at full back and centre back and was noted for his tough and uncompromising style. He was a member of the county senior panel in the early 2000's. This is his first year to serve as a selector with the senior team. He is married to Sharon and they have three children.

Gavin Durkin

A great coach, with a lot of experience coaching both men's and ladies' teams.. In recent years he has mentored both St Francis and Drumkeerin ladies in recent years. Unfortunately a promising career as a pacey and powerful forward was cut short by recurring shoulder injuries. Despite this he still lines out at Junior level for the club. He is married to Carol and has three children.

Ballinaglera Club History

There is very little mention of Ballinaglera in the GAA history books; however, the records show that we had representation at the 1889 County convention with **Hugh Ferguson** and **John Mc Sweeney** representing the Ballinaglera Gladstonians. Games were played locally during these early years with 4 teams drawn from the Ballinaglera parish often playing each other and playing local matches in Aughnasheelin, Drumkeerin and Gubaveeney. Ballinaglera was also represented on the famous Connacht winning Leitrim team of 1927 by a Fr. Rynn - most likely from Tullynaha. Ballinaglera is in a unique position in Leitrim GAA because, in so far as we know, it was a hurling team rather than football that was first formally set up within the confines of the parish thanks to **Jim Wall** (Wexford) and Tom Shine (Cork) who lived in the parish for a period in the early 1950's. But when Wall and Shine were no more the team also faded away. A Junior football club was soon formed under the Dowra name in 1959. The driving forces behind this formation were the bank manager in Dowra at the time, **Kevin Mahon** and a curate in Doobally by the name of **Fr O'Dowd.** The team wore a red and white hooped jersey, similar to our club colours today. They contested and won a North Leitrim Junior Final in 1961. The team was a disparate group, with players from far and wide, but backboned by Glera men - Mick Gildea, Frankie Wynne, Joe Maguire, Paddy Mc Morrow, Paddy Mc Tiernan, Mick Wynne, Owen Wynne and Jim ' Skerry' Rynn as captain. Prior to 1959 there was no formal club set up in the parish. A lot of what we know of football prior to this time is passed down as folklore and by word of mouth. Great players mentioned before this time include, Hughie Creamer, Sonny O' Hara, Charlie Mc Morrow, Peter Durkin, Francie Mc Greal, Paddy Wynne to name a few. A flat field to play the game in was also hard to find in this mountainous parish. But places such as **Sonny Patrick's** Sraheen in Slievenakilla, Brown's Field in Fahy, Sonny Ned's Hill in Dowra and Mc Morrows Point in Fahy and Tierney's **Tully** in Stradrina were used frequently by the young sportsmen of the parish to play the games they loved and to hold local tournaments.

After the demise of the Dowra team in the early 1960's, those Ballinaglera players that had not emigrated, joined a football club serving the Lough Allen area which was known as St Francis's. It was made up of mostly Ballinaglera and Drumshanbo players, **Sonny O' Rourke**, **Packie Joe Dolan** and **Pee Mc Hugh** were the driving forces of the GAA within the parish at the time. A new club was then set up in 1969 to serve the area and became known as Allen Gaels. They were very successful and quickly went on to win 3 successive Senior League titles in the 1970's, an U 21 Championship and two senior hurling titles.

Allen Gaels at the time formed the backbone of the county senior team, with names like **Mulvey, Cullen, Mc Gourty, Mc Morrow, Gilmartin** and **O'Rourke** often lining out for the Green & Gold during this period. In fact at one League game against Laois in the mid-1970's there were six Ballinaglera men on the pitch at one time. Spurred on by this depth of talent, in 1981 Ballinaglera formed their own club and quickly proved competitive winning the Junior C title in 1984. In 1992 the Junior A team won both the League and Championship double with the championship that year being won after a replay against today's opponents Dromahair. The pinnacle for the club however was in winning the Intermediate title in 1996 defeating Annaduff in the final. We contested at Senior level for approximately 10 years after this but failed to win any silverware at the top grade in Leitrim.

The first recognised grounds the Ballinaglera GAA club used was a field rented off **Paddy O' Rourke** in Tullyvacan from 1981-1988. Our new club grounds Páirc Naomh h-Aodh were opened in 1988. A training pitch was added in 2009 along with a children's playground and a new indoor sports hall was finished just this year. We look forward to the future with optimism, regardless of today's result.

St Patrick's Dromahair Club History



St Patrick's GAA Club Dromahair has existed in it's current format since 1955. Prior to this there would have been 3 clubs in the area at different times namely Killenummery, Creevelea/Killargue and Dromahair Joe Biggars. There was some initial success for the club winning the North Leitrim Junior and Minor titles in 1956.

In the 60s the club had some success at juvenile level particularly in 1966/67 and this was thanks mainly to the

tireless work of **Josie Torsney** who also worked with our young people on the cultural side with Scor and the club was very prominent on this scene winning many titles in the following years.

In 1976 the club won it's first Junior County title and in what was a very successful year also added the U12 County Championship. However, like many clubs emigration hit the club hard with many players moving on. In the 1980s the juvenile side of the club was reorganised with more coaches and regular training bringing U12 and U14 Rural Championship titles in the middle of the decade. It wasn't until 1998 that the fruits of this labour paid off with the Junior Championship returning to Dromahair after victory over Eslin in the final.

In 2001 the Junior Championship was won again and the club built on this competing well in the Intermediate Championship and earning promotion to the Senior League in 2009. This was also the year that saw the club take part in the RTE television show Celebrity Bainisteoir under Leitrim comedian **Katherine Lynch** beating Cuala from Dublin and Rockwell from Tipperary before being pipped at the final hurdle by Glasdrumman from Co Down in a memorable

community generated by this will live long in the memory.

In 2014 the club finally won the Intermediate Championship title for the first time in it's history defeating Ballinamore Sean O'Heslin's in the final and going on to compete in the Senior Championship until our relegation in 2019. We aim to get back there again on Sunday!



The 2021 Smith Monumentals Leitrim Intermediate Football Championship has been fascinating to watch and commentate on for us all at Leitrim Daily and FinalWhistle.ie

There have been fine individual performances such as **Martin Feeney** hitting all of Dromahair's scores in their win in the original group meeting of today's finalists back in late August to Ballinaglera's fantastic underdog performances in the knockout stages since scraping into the quarter finals all those weeks ago.

I think even the most ardent 'Glera fan will agree that three defeats from four games isn't exactly championship winning form, but after squeaking through to the quarter finals they've shown exactly what they are capable of with impressive wins over Drumreilly and turned a ten point group stage defeat at the hands of Kiltubrid into a seven point semi final victory in just four weeks.

Ballinaglera have been the comeback kings of 2021 in Leitrim GAA and will take huge inspiration from Ballinamore Sean O'Heslin's Senior victory last weekend having lost their opening two group games this season. They'll be looking for another underdog performance to leave Avant Money Páirc Sean Mac Diarmada this afternoon with their first Intermediate championship in 25 years.

Speaking of underdogs, a veteran of that storied Gaelic Games television series, **Jamie Conlon** has been for me the stand out player across the Intermediate Championship this season, while his team mate Feeney has been gathering the headlines for his scoring prowess. Centre back Conlon has been hugely influential in pulling the strings from his deep lying playmaking position for the north Leitrim side.

There are a lot of similarities between this final and the one we witnessed last weekend. Dromahair carry the favourites tag having made relatively light work of each of their opponents, with the notable exception of Annaduff. Have they really been tested in a game of consequence and will they be able to deal with the fighting performance that 'Glera have the potential to deliver today.? We'll know a little more in just over an hour.

At Leitrim Daily and Final Whistle our biggest additions for this year have been the Leitrim GAA Podcast in association with Leitrim GAA, the Club Championship Souvenir Programme, a 192 page book detailing all football clubs, men's and ladies', in the county featuring every senior squad player in each club.

I'm also very proud to have been able to add live commentary to almost each and every championship game across the Senior, Intermediate and Ladies Senior games throughout the county with today's game being the 71st broadcast live by a member of our team as well as four fixtures on the Leitrim GAA Live Stream at the Championship quarter final stages. Our sports team has grown from just myself armed with that original small backpack of equipment, to an audio / video studio space in the Hive in Carrick on Shannon, a team of eighteen commentators and contributors on our Leitrim GAA coverage and almost thirty freelance reporters working at a national level on FinalWhistle.ie for our Rugby and Soccer coverage with our national Gaelic coverage due to launch in early 2022 to grow the team even further.

A massive thank you must go to the production team of editor **Philip Rooney**, researcher **Con Doyle** and designer **Daniel Moran** who were all involved in creating and compiling our Championship preview book.

To our reporters and commentators Seamus Gallagher, Derek Kelleher, Colm Moran, Declan Moran, Deniese O'Flaherty, Tony Ghee, Darren Mulvey, Peter O'Reilly, Ray Lannon, Joe Walpole, Brendan Guckian, Tommy Moran, Padraic Davis, Gerry Fowley, Frankie Reynolds, Niamh Kelly, Pat Flanagan & Clare Owens who all lent their voices to us this summer, they deserve a huge thank you for bringing audiences to our games.

Today is an important one for all the Leitrim GAA fraternity, but it is also especially so for every woman, child and man from the north Leitrim parishes of Dromahair and Ballinaglera, since their respective teams will do battle to become Leitrim's 2021 intermediate football champions in Avant Money Páirc Seán MacDiarmada.

Dromahair had an impressive run on the road to today's final when overcoming Aughnasheelin, Ballinaglera (by 5 points) and Kiltubrid in the Group 1 Preliminary games while suffering one defeat at the hands of Annaduff. In the quarter-final Dromahair got the better of Bornacoola and they beat Annaduff in the semi-final. Meanwhile Ballinaglera's only win in the Group 1 Preliminary games was over Aughnasheelin

Meanwhile Ballinaglera's only win in the Group 1 Preliminary games was over Aughnasheelin while they suffered defeats at the hands of Annaduff, Dromahair and Kiltubrid. But Ballinaglera were certainly impressive after that on their way to today's final with notable victories over Drumreilly in the quarter-final and against Kiltubrid in the semi-final.

The Dromahair Club was founded in 1886, just two years after the GAA was established in Hayes Hotel, Thurles, Co. Tipperary in 1884. Former St. Patrick's Dromahair stalwart, the late Terry Layden (Senior) when detailing the Club's early history, noted "two other (parish) Clubs were formed in the same year (1886), namely Killenummery and Killargue/Creevelea. "These three clubs now cover the catchment area of the St. Patrick's GAA Club. The Dromahair Club in 1886 was known as the Dromahair Joe Biggars. The formation of GAA Clubs, following on the foundation of the Gaelic Athletic Association, was rapid and widespread but the early enthusiasm did not last, mainly due to famine, emigration and agrarian unrest."

Ballinaglera GAA Club, according to the Club's Blog (ballinagleragaa.home.blog) has been formed since 1981. Prior to that Ballinaglera players lined out in the colours of Allen Gaels, when the Drumshanbo and Ballinaglera parishes were a combined force in Leitrim GAA affairs for many years.

Both Ballinaglera and Dromahair have won one Leitrim intermediate championship title each with Ballinaglera's win coming a quarter century ago in 1996, while Dromahair was victorious seven years ago in 2014. After today's All-North Leitrim Leitrim final, either Ballinaglera or Dromahair, will have added to one of their respective roles of honour with an additional intermediate championship county title to their credit.

Since 1928, when Mohill won the first Leitrim intermediate football championship, there have been 37 other Clubs crowned as county champions in this grade. After 1928 the Leitrim intermediate championship grade lapsed for another 43 years and afterwards only two championship football grades were played annually in the county, namely, senior and junior.

The Leitrim intermediate football championship was revived again in 1971 when Melvin Gaels were victorious but it lapsed again from 1975 to 1988. Since then the Leitrim intermediate football championship has taken place annually for the next 31 years. St. Mary's Kiltoghert and Melvin Gaels top the Leitrim intermediate football championship roll of honour list with four titles each won. Melvin Gaels claimed Leitrim intermediate football championship titles in 1971, 1992, 2011 and 2015 while St. Mary's victories came in 1995, 1997, 2000 and 2004.
