# **Mohill Club History**

The Mohill Faugh a Ballagh Club was founded in rooms on Glebe St. on the 27th of January 1889; the first active club in Leitrim and going strong ever since. Mohill won their first ever Leitrim Senior Football Championship a year later in 1890. We added Senior Championships in 1914 and 1929 but it was 42 years until we tasted success at Senior level again winning the 1971 Championship. We contested the 1972 and 1974 finals but it would be another 35 years before the Fenagh Cup would spend the winter in Mohill again. In a classic final in Páirc Naomh Mhuire, Cloone on the 8th of October 2006, we snatched victory in a dramatic finale against St. Marys coming from 5 points down with 8 minutes to go to win by one on a scoreline of 0-13 to 1-9; our fifth Senior Championship title.

In recent years, we have been lucky enough to reach the County Senior Final on six occasions in nine seasons between 2013 and 2021. Today is our third appearance in a row on County Final day. In 2015 we added our 6th Senior title beating Glencar-Manorhamilton in a replay and once again in dramatic circumstances. The man who had kicked the winning point in the 2006 final, deep in injury time, was in the right place once again. The ball fell to Ronan Kennedy who made no mistake in despatching the ball to the net in one of the most dramatic finishes to a County Final in Leitrim football history with Mohill winning out 1-4 to 0-6.

We returned on Final Day in 2017 with Glencar-Manorhamilton the opponents once again. In a fantastic game which produced football of the highest standard, we were triumphant on a scoreline of 0-14 to 0-11. This day will always be remembered as club stalwart Mary Kennedy lifted the Fenagh Cup on behalf of our club in front of a joyous sea of supporters on the Pairc Seán pitch below. Sadly Mary passed to her eternal reward eight months later and she will be in all of our thoughts today in what would be such an important day for her. Our most recent success and our 8th Senior title came in 2020 when we defeated today's opponents St. Marys on a scoreline of 0-14 to 0-9 in a Championship played through Covid-19 which meant the attendance was limited to 200 people. A very different atmosphere to what we expect at today's final.

To add to our success at Senior level we have won 2 Intermediate, 6 Junior A, 6 Under 21, 12 Minor A and 13 Under 16 Championship titles. We have always been a prominent club at underage level in the county tasting a lot of success throughout the decades which contributed greatly to winning at senior level. The club has a very active underage structure at present with coaches out every Saturday morning organising and attending blitzes for our U6's up to U11's. Great work is also being carried out with our U13's, 15's and 17's as they compete well in every competition at a high level.

Today's final is familiar territory for both of these clubs and certainly not an unfamiliar pairing for County Final Day. This is the fourth meeting of Mohill and St Marys Kiltoghert in the Senior Championship Final. Mohill winning in 2006 and 2020 with St Marys taking the spoils in the 2013 Final. We wish the panel and management every success today. Fág a'bealach!

### Pairc Philb MhicAonghusa

Football was first played at St Manchans GAA Park in the 1940s with many important county games played there during the 40s and 50s. The pitch was closed in February 2010 for revamp and reopened in 2012. It was rededicated in memory of the late great Philly McGuinness who sadly passed away in April 2010. Philly played at full forward in the 2006 Senior final alongside brothers Michael and John in what was a historic day for our club.

### **Mohill Team Captain Keith Beirne**

25 year old Keith Beirne is our team captain and this year marks his first year as captain of the Mohill side. Keith is the son of Michael and the late Mai Beirne RIP. His brother Jonathan also plays on our senior team while sisters Michelle and Dearbhaile line out for the ladies team. Keith works as a trainee solicitor in WP Toolans in Ballinamore. Although only 25, Keith has already achieved so much in his sporting career. Keith won every underage medal with the club from U12 up to U21 and balanced this well with his soccer career where he spent time playing in Longford, Mullingar and Dublin. He signed a semi-professional contract with Longford Town in 2015 and represented them in the League of Ireland. To Leitrim and Mohill's fortune, Keith decided to concentrate on GAA and has been a member of the Leitrim Senior panel since 2017. He also, along with his family members, won Ireland's Fittest Family in 2017. Today, he plays in his 6th County Senior Final and looks to top off a fantastic year of personal achievement where he finished 5th in the overall top scorers in this vear's Allianz National Football League ahead of



Kerry's David Clifford and Galway's Shane Walsh. Keith won the Man of the Match award in both the 2017 and 2020 County Finals and today will be hoping to go one step further and lift the Fenagh Cup for Mohill.

# St Mary's Kiltoghert Club History

The present day St. Mary's GAA club was re-formed in March 1944 at a meeting in the Town Hall, Carrick on Shannon. The following officers were elected: Chairman: Fr Bernie Keville R.I.P., Secretary: Brother Gabriel R.I.P.

Treasurer: Brother Patrick R.I.P.

With no grounds of our own, we rented facilities at the Showground's on the Boyle road. In 1965 the Club purchased land at Townspark, Carrick on Shannon and in the mid-80s developed Páirc Uí Chearnaigh, which has served the club very well down through the years. Due to increasing demands on our facilities, we purchased additional land at Attifinlay in 1996 and developed our present clubhouse and facilities which were opened in 2003. In 2010 we upgraded our facilities providing a training area and conditioning hill. With over 800 members in our club, we are currently looking to upgrade our existing facilities. We are hopeful that work will commence on this project very soon.

Over the years our club has had many great sporting feats - claiming five Senior Championship titles in 1958, 1995, 2003, 2007 and 2013, Intermediate titles in 1995, 1997, 2000 and 2004, Numerous underage titles at all age levels whilst many of our members have been part of many successful days with Carrick Hurling over the years.

We also have a very successful ladies section in the club where we field teams at all levels and have won Jun B, Jun A Intermediate Championships as well as adult leagues and numerous underage titles and 2021 saw the formation of a "Mothers and Others" group who having taken part in many Blitz's over the past 18 mths.

Scór has been an integral part of our club since the 70's. We have won Connacht titles in Ballad Group, Novelty Act, Figure Dancing and Junior Ballad Group and All Ireland titles in Recitation and most recently, our Junior Ballad Group in 2019. Our Senior Ballad Group had the honour of performing at half time in Croke Park for the All Ireland hurling semi-finals in 2016.

We have a strong tradition of members serving at executive level on Co Committee over the years and have always been supportive of all County Teams.

With a very vibrant club with over 800 members involved in adult, ladies, and men's teams, underage teams, scór and many of our members also play with Carrick Hurling. Our underage structure is very active, with many of today's Senior panel involved in passing on their skills and assisting with coaching our underage teams. Carrick Area U10 Community Games teams have done very well over the last 10 years, winning County, Connacht and All Ireland titles, most notably Gold in 2011 and 2017, Silver in 2013 and bronze in 2010. It's no small coincidence that many of today's panellists were part of this success.

Today we wish our Senior team and Management the very best of luck. Their commitment, dedication and passion are exemplary and all club members and supporters are extremely proud of them.

We also acknowledge all those who served our club with distinction, on and off the field over the years, which has helped us to be the club we are today. We remember with fondness all our good club people who have passed away over the years, today we remember especially those who are no longer with us since our last County Final appearance in 2020. They have left a void in the club, never to be filled, but we know they are very much with us all today.

Once again may we take this opportunity to thank all our sponsors for their continued support and all those who continue to support us in every way. This support will ensure our club continues to thrive at the highest level.

### Familiarity certainly doesn't breed contempt

If these two teams contesting today's Connacht Gold Leitrim Senior Football Championship Final don't know each other by now, then they'll never will because the battle for the Fenagh Cup will be the fourth time these teams face off against each other this year alone!

When you add in the County Finals in 2006, 2013 and 2020 to the mix, then there is a rich history to this contest and we're all hoping we add another storied chapter to that history to day in Avant Money Páirc Sean Mac Diarmada.



That's a lot of water under the bridge and the way these things usually go in the GAA world is that over-familiarity with any one team - particularly when you're battling it out for the ultimate honour in Leitrim club football - breeds a little bit more than contempt with rivalries, real and imagined, inflated beyond all belief.

But the sense I'm getting from these two teams is not contempt for each other but respect. Mohill are looking over their shoulder at an up and coming St Mary's team who have the potential to dominate in the years ahead while St Mary's look at Mohill as the giant to be slain and the team to emulate.

Respect doesn't mean they'll hold back today - both teams will go at each other at 100 miles an hour. Anyone who takes a step back will hear about it from their teammates whatever about from the stands but the ferocity of the hits, the intensity of the battle only underlines the respect, however underplayed it might be, they have for each other.

It has been that way in the past, it will be that way today and again into the future as the history of these teams reinforces that notion. Just ask Ronan Kennedy and Brian O'Donnell, two men who came on to great effect in the semi-finals and who were on the field together in Cloone all the way back in 2006.

Think 2006 is too far to go back for two teams grounded in the here and now? That game, where Carrick were cruising to victory, six points up, was transformed in the final quarter with then 18-year-old Ronan Kennedy scoring the winning point as Mohill claimed their first title in 35 years.

O'Donnell started at centre-forward that day for Mary's and while many years have passed since then, both are still giving their all on the field of play - Kennedy with a killer goal against Leitrim Gaels and O'Donnell tucking away a penalty in the shootout win over Fenagh St Caillins. Neither O'Donnell and Kennedy will underestimate the opposition today and neither will either of the two clubs because they know all too well what the other brings to the table.

I don't know if we will get a classic today but I do know that both Mohill and St Mary's Kiltoghert truly respect the team facing them and that, hopefully, will bring out the best in both teams.

# **Ballinamore Area Community Games U-10 Team**

In a very tight contest, with 10 mins out of the 40 left to play, the Leitrim Champions only led by 2 points but a superb finish saw a score line at the end read 4-11 to 2-5 and Leitrim were heading to the All Ireland Final later that day.

In the final they met Ulster Champions Monaghan Town who had beaten Ballincollig from Cork earlier. An excellent first half saw Ballinamore Area lead by 2-5 to 0-1 at half time but within 5 mins Monaghan had 2 goals and the lead was down to 3! But again the Leitrim lads would not yield and a brilliant finish saw them crowned All Ireland champions on a score-line of 5-8 to 3-5.

The campaign that started back in July will live long in the memory of the players, coaches, parents and families. The fabulous home coming, with the Connacht and All Ireland Trophies, through Fenagh and into Ballinamore, where all the local clubs were out in huge numbers, made it a night to remember for young and old alike.

The team went unbeaten over 13 games between challenges and competitive games – as well as having numerous training sessions with a dedicated group of coaches, who like everyone else, saw their potential from early on.

### Will the balance of power shift from Mohill to Carrick-on-Shannon

Where there is definitely a feeling of 'déjà Vu' about the 2022 Connacht Gold Leitrim Senior Football final, you could still argue that the narrative surrounding the build-up to this year's final is a lot different from the corresponding fixture two years ago. For a start, the two clubs have changed management teams with Eamonn O Hara and Alan Flynn in their first season in charge of their respective clubs. Both managers have impressive CVs and big reputations and the battle on the sideline will be more than an interesting subplot today.

Whereas Mohill was involved in a senior final that attracted national praise last year, the semifinals of the 2021 championship were a major bump in the road for both St Mary's Kiltoghert and Mohill. St Mary's failed to show up last year against Ballinamore Sean O' Heslins and must have been really disappointed after the progress of the previous year under Denis Connerton who perhaps had brought the development project on faster than anybody could have predicted. The experience that Mary's endured in the last four of the competition can sometimes happen to a young team still learning the ropes, and from what I witnessed of Mary's at underage and senior in recent years, it's no surprise to me that they are back at the business end of the competition.

The point I'm making about Mohill in last year's semi is more difficult to see. Up until the semi-final they looked simply unbeatable, destined to win the much coveted back-to-back titles that has to be the one big domestic target for this great team. Yet somehow what happened against Leitrim Gaels last year maybe instilled a degree of self-doubt in Mohill and belief in Ballinamore that the final was up for grabs. Recovering from the respective final and semi-final disappointments from last year was something that both clubs had to achieve and perhaps resulted in St Mary's and Mohill having to reach the final via the quarter-final route. The new championship format which most people seem to be happy with resulted in Leitrim Gaels and Fenagh St Caillins claiming the automatic places in the last four while Mohill and St Marys had to contest quarter-finals. St Mary's enjoyed a big win over Aughawillan while Mohill had a tougher task in a repeat of last year's final and perhaps they extracted some form of revenge in the process of the win over Sean O Heslin's.

Did playing a quarter-final stand to St Marys and Mohill in the semi-finals? Difficult to know. Fenagh refused to die. Ray Tubman's side were eventually knocked out in the cruellest of fashions on penalties. Mohill again were provided with a stern test by Leitrim Gaels and while maybe not as severe as last year, they had to dig deep to overcome it.

So loads to ponder ahead of the County final, and as always expected the unexpected. Remember the way that Kerry deployed Donaghy at the start of 2014 All Ireland final? Paul Geaney played havoc, and the aura around Jim McGuinness as a tactical god was slightly diminished.

In 2001 I remember heading to Croke Park for the All-Ireland final between Galway and Meath. The talk prior to the match was dominated by the battle of Darren Fay the royal full-back and Padraig Joyce Galway's full forward. John O Mahony, in a master stroke, played Joyce out deep, sometimes on the sideline and a Meath team that destroyed Kerry in the semi-final took a bad beating from Galway.

One incident could change the course of history again today it is what compels us to never miss an occasion such as this. So who's going to come up with the little bit of magic today? Time will tell.

Finally, on a personal note, it's been a privilege to have been involved in the live streaming of the club matches again this season. Thankfully supporters are back in attendance the atmosphere has returned to huge occasions again. The Leitrim GAA streaming service continues to bring the games to people all over the world while many are also watching here at home- thank you for doing so.
