

This year marks the 70th anniversary of Melvin Gaels CLG, a club deeply rooted in the picturesque village of Kinlough, nestled in North Leitrim. The club's foundation dates back to November 19, 1954, though the groundwork was laid a year earlier with its inaugural meeting. The first executive board, comprised of esteemed local figures, featured Cannon Dolan as President, Martin Bernard McGowan as Chairman, Bat White as Secretary, and Owen Greene as Treasurer. Greene's involvement added a historical touch, as he had bravely fought in the 1916 Rising at Boland's Mill.

Geographically, Melvin Gaels sits at the heart of an area that borders three counties—Donegal, Fermanagh, and Sligo. While Kinlough remains the club's home, its reach spans into the surrounding areas of Tullaghan, Askill, Glenade, Rossinver, Glenaniff, and even Ballintrillick in County Sligo. Despite Ballintrillick being outside Leitrim, it has long contributed players and support, reflecting the club's strong community ties across parish lines.

On the field, Melvin Gaels has built an impressive legacy. The club has claimed seven Leitrim Senior Football Championships, the latest in 2012, alongside four Intermediate Championships, most recently in 2015. The addition of a reserve team in the mid-90s sparked further success, with Junior League and Championship titles, culminating in a third adult team formed in 2022. Remarkably, this fledgling side captured the Leitrim Junior C title in their first season.

With a thriving youth structure catering to both boys and girls from Under-7 to Under-19, the future of Melvin Gaels looks bright. The blue and white jerseys, a nod to Rev. J. Dolan P.P., a founding member and proud Cavan native, continue to inspire generations.

As Melvin Gaels celebrates its 70th year, it remains a symbol of passion, pride, and perseverance in Leitrim football.

#### **Melvin Gaels Captains and Management**

**Shane McGloin (Captain)**The 23-year-old captain of Melvin Gaels, has quickly established himself as a key player and leader on the field. A native of Castlegal, Shane made his Senior debut in 2019 in a Division 1 game under the guidance of then-manager James Phelan, where he was part of the starting fifteen that secured a victory against Gortletteragh. Shane's talent and leadership were evident early in his career. At just 15, he played a pivotal role in Melvin Gaels' U18 team that won the Minor A Championship in 2016. He continued to add to his list of achievements, winning the U17 B Championship in 2018 and the U20 A Championship in 2019. Now, as captain and a half-back for the Gael, Shane is known for



his strong leadership and determined presence on the pitch. A building contractor by profession, he brings the same work ethic and reliability to football, always ready to support his teammates and drive the team forward with his commitment and passion. Shane McGloin embodies the spirit of Melvin Gaels, leading by example and playing with the grit and determination that inspires his teammates every time he steps onto the field.



Aidan Murray (Manager), a native of Ballyshannon, is now in his second year at the helm of Melvin Gaels, where his impact as a manager is being felt. In his first year, he successfully guided the Gaels to the intermediate final, showcasing his leadership and tactical prowess. Before joining Melvin Gaels, Aidan managed Naomh Bríd, where he achieved a significant milestone in 2022 by leading the club to a Division 3 final victory. This triumph marked Naomh Bríd's return to Division 2 after a decade-long absence, underlining Aidan's ability to revive and inspire teams. As a player, Aidan enjoyed a decorated career in Donegal, winning three intermediate reserve championships. His extensive managerial and coaching experience across all age levels at the club level makes him a versatile and knowledgeable leader. Aidan's skills as a manager were further recognised when he served as a selector for the Donegal Masters team in 2020. Under the management of his father, Val Murray, the team reached the pinnacle of success, securing All-Ireland glory—a proud achievement for both Aidan and his family.

Joe Tiffoney, (Selector), a dedicated Gael and a key selector for Melvin Gaels, has been deeply involved in the GAA community throughout his life. Hailing from Glenade, Joe's football journey began in Aghanlish National School, where he made his mark early on, winning the all-Ireland "Two Teacher National Schools Championship" in both 1984 and 1985. At just 16 years old, Joe made his Junior football debut for Melvin Gaels, showcasing his talent at a remarkably young age. His playing career reached a peak in 1998 when he captained Melvin Gaels to a historic Senior County Championship victory—the club's first in 35 years. He also tasted success in 1991, winning the Intermediate Championship. Joe's talents were not limited to club level. From 1996 to 2000, he represented Leitrim as a wing half-back, proudly wearing the county jersey and bringing his hard-working, determined style of play to the inter-county stage.

**Val Murray (Selector),** father of current Melvin Gaels manager Aidan Murray, returns to the club as a selector, bringing with him a wealth of experience and a history of success. Val previously managed Melvin Gaels in 2008, guiding the team to a Division 1 title. His deep understanding of the game and tactical expertise are widely respected.

#### **Allen Gaels Club History**

The first GAA Club was formed in Drumshanbo in 1889 under the name "St. Patrick's". Over the following 70 years the Club struggled, survived, died and revived. Finally, in 1962, it established a permanent place in the community and never looked back. Drumshanbo, then called St. Francis, won it's first county title in any grade in 1963 – the Leitrim Junior Championship.

Allen Gaels was formed in 1969 when Drumshanbo and next-door neighbours, Ballinaglera, decided to amalgamate and taking their name from Lough Allen, they went on to win 3 successive Senior League Titles in 1973, 1974 & 1975 as well as 2 Senior Hurling Titles in 1975 & 1977. The combination parted amicably in 1981 when Ballinaglera opted to form their own club, with Drumshanbo continuing on their own and retaining the name Allen Gaels.

After an initial slump, when the Club first team competed in the Junior B grade, a steady climb to success began with a Junior League Title in 1986. It progressed rapidly with Minor A, Junior A & Intermediate Championship wins in the following 3 years and culminated in Drumshanbo's first Senior Championship in 1991, to climax a remarkable period of success under manager, Frank McKeon. The Club added 4 more senior championships in 1996, 1997, 2001 and 2002 under managers, Eamonn McGowan, Denis Conerton & Denis Johnson. The Connacht Club Final appearance in 1997 was a particular highlight when the Club lost to eventual All Ireland Champions, Corofin on a scoreline of 2-10 to 0-11.

The Club's last appearance in a senior final was in 2002 when they defeated today's opponents, Melvin Gaels, 0-11 to 0-07 with Donnacha Lynch scoring 0-08 points. All of Drumshanbo will settle for a repeat in this year's final!

Since 2002, the Club has only competed in one adult championship final in the flagship competitions, winning the Junior A Championship in 2008. The Club retained senior status until 2021 and has competed in the Intermediate grade since, reaching the semi-final in both 2022 and 2023.

The Club has enjoyed regular underage success throughout this period and consistently produces excellent juvenile teams. Indeed, several players from our most recent Minor A success in 2020 take the field today.

Ladies football in the Club has enjoyed a welcome revival with great numbers taking part and the St. Francis Ladies have shown the way with Intermediate success last week! Both Michelle Monaghan and Lauryn McKeon represented the Club on the successful Leitrim Team that claimed the All-Ireland Intermediate Title in August.

Since a new pitch and clubhouse were opened in 2008, the Club's facilities have expanded, and a new all-weather flood lit training pitch is in the pipeline and is due to open at Shane McGettigan Park in 2025. We look forward to an exciting future on and off the field.

#### **Allen Gaels Captains and Management**

**Shane Beirne** & **Adrian Sorohan** (Joint Captains) **Shane** a HR professional has been an everpresent member of the senior panel since his debut in 2011. One of the most loyal and committed players in the Club, this is his second year as joint Captain, and he has lifted the Division 2 League Cup last year and the Spring League Trophy this year. He was also part of the management team of the club's U-15 team this



year, further highlighting his commitment to the club.

**Adrian** is in his first year as joint Captain. A Committed player known for playing with a smile on his face. Adrian made his debut for Allen Gaels in 2012 and is well regarded as one of the best man markers the club has produced. He is a maths teacher by trade, and his positivity and energy has been a great benefit to the team since his return home two years ago.



#### **Manager: James Flynn**

James is a long-term servant of Allen Gaels. He joined the Senior Panel in 2003 and made the transition to management during 2022. Married with four proud Allen Gaels boys, he also coaches the under 7's and under 9's in the club. He is a woodwork teacher in St. Mogues College Bawnboy, where he has coached them to two Ulster Schools titles.

#### **Selector: Stephen Tiernan**

A lifelong Allen Gaels man and former player who has been selector for three years now. Running his own business and with a young family he still finds the time for his beloved Gaels, with an infectious energy and enthusiasm for the game.

#### **Coach: James Deane**

James hails from the Shannon Gaels club in Roscommon. This is his second year on the management team. James has a wealth of experience in coaching at all levels at both club and county and has been a great asset to the group.

#### **Stats: Paddy Beirne**

Originally from Drumshanbo, Paddy is now married and living in Fenagh. This is his first year on the management team and he has brought a great level of detail and expertise to the role.

#### A Return to the Top Table

Dining at the top table of club football in Leitrim is where today's teams contesting the Leitrim Intermediate final believe they belong. It's difficult to argue when you consider their tradition and the level of talent within their current ranks. It might be a little early to start making any sort of predictions on how suitable they would be as senior outfits but I genuinely could see either of these teams at least holding their own.



When I first took up the mic for Leitrim commentaries back almost 30 years ago Allen Gaels were enjoying a golden era, they won 5 senior county senior titles between 1991 and 2002, the legacy of that great team has been difficult to match over the past twenty years until perhaps now. In Drumshanbo optimism has to be increasing for a number of reasons, Radek Oberwan's performance in the semi-final victory over Drumkeerin was outstanding, his brother Arek along with the likes of Foley, Tobin, and Duffy present evidence why the current generation could in time challenge the dominance of Mohill, Ballinamore and St Marys. Allen Gaels have strength in depth and have players such as Sorohan, Flynn, Wynne, and Mulvey that have experience of getting the job done.

Tradition and being compared to the successful teams from bygone eras is something that the Melvin Gaels players have to live with. From working on some of their games in recent years, the words 'resilient' and 'determined' spring to mind. The point was made to me before the semi-final that in Kinlough supporters are waiting for this team to ignite, on closer examination however the game plan which has been so effective in getting them this far does not really lend itself to free flowing attacking football. Melvin Gaels would, I'd say be happy to dig into the trenches and grind this one out. Several times against Kiltubrid they were on the edge but clawed themselves back and then in the semi-final they strangled the life out of Carrigallen. Once Melvin Gaels scored their goal in the first half there was only ever going to be one winner; if they get a lead to defend, they are dangerous and difficult to beat.

They too have potential match winners - Ferguson is a real threat, Peter McGowan has struggled with injury, but his presence alone is huge for Melvin Gaels. Liam Ryan's work rate and helping the transition from defence to attack is key and in Kevin McGloin I see a goalkeeper that reminds me of Martin McHugh but more comfortable of meeting the current needs of being that plus one in the modern game. Conor Sheridan, the Clancy's and Philip McGwoan are also players to watch today.

Allen Gaels avoided the quarter finals after finishing second once the group stages were completed. In the semi-final they cut loose in the second half against Drumkeerin. They had the ability to take goals while enjoying a bounce from their bench.

But there is room for improvement from the semi-final, they were slow to get motoring – this could be one of the downsides of no quarter final. The other area that concerned me was the panic the long ball that dropped in between full back and goalkeeper caused. This had a domino effect on other areas of their performance.

Melvin Gaels have a game plan that is built on a huge work rate and all 15 players working like dogs, but when 15 becomes 14 and 14 becomes 13 space opens and a team like Allen Gaels could destroy you. Discipline will be massive today. It is one thing breaking up a game and strategic fouling is part of the course nowadays for all teams; however, if a referee loses patience the dynamics totally change.

It's time since 2002 that the teams have clashed in a final. Allen Gaels were 5 point winners that day with Angus Fee scoring the crucial goal 22 years ago in the senior decider. The first goal scored today could be a big factor if Melvin Gael score it then expect them to execute a well worked game plan; if Allen Gaels establish an advantage, then the shackles would have to come of for both teams and we could get an enjoyable match.

#### Who will sail into the 2025 Leitrim Senior Championship?

Since both today's finalists – Melvin Gaels and Allen Gaels – are both strongly associated with two of the county's major lakes, namely, Lough Melvin and Lough Allen, the question to be answered this afternoon is who will win the Smith Monumentals decider and sail into the 2025 Leitrim senior championship ranks?



On their way to the final Allen Gaels had a comprehensive thirteen point's semi-final win over Drumkeerin in Mohill on Saturday, September 28. One day later Melvin Gaels overcame the top team from the preliminary championship rounds, Carrigallen with seven points to spare in Drumshanbo.

Since Allen Gaels and Carrigallen emerged as the two top teams after their four preliminary championship games both got straight through to the semi-finals. Meanwhile Melvin Gaels gained a semi-final spot when they got the better of Kiltubrid in a quarter-final replay at Drumshanbo by an eight point's margin on Sunday, September 22.

In the preliminary stages of the championship Allen Gaels drew with St. Mary's Kiltoghert and Drumkeerin and registered wins against Aughavas and Aughnasheelin. In their preliminary championship games Melvin Gaels lost to Aughavas but then went on to beat St. Mary's Kiltoghert, Ballinaglera and Kiltubrid.

Allen Gaels played five games in the intermediate championship in order to reach today's final and have had a shorter journey to travel in their bid to claim the Frank Reynolds Cup. On the other hand Melvin Gaels have had to play seven games in their longer journey to seek the Leitrim intermediate title for the second year in a row after having lost out to Annaduff in last year's decider by just two points.

Melvin Gaels perhaps as a result of last year's loss to Annaduff in the 2023 county final will be a little hungrier for victory than Allen Gaels today. Or maybe Allen Gaels, who took the most direct route to today's final will capitalise on their advantage of being fresher than Melvin Gales for this afternoon's showdown.

Meanwhile this year in the county's second most important club's competition – the Masonite Leagues – Allen Gaels lost all the Division One games this season while Melvin Gaels won five of their seven Division Two games to reach the final in which they were defeated by old north Leitrim rivals, Glencar Manor by a three point's margin (1-13 to 0-13).


