Employed by HSE at St Clare's Hospital, Manorhamilton, Tom has been refereeing since 2000 and has made very steady progress since first becoming a knight of the whistle. He has taken charge of numerous games at all levels in the intervening years and among his many important assignments have been the IFC Final replay 2006, SFC semi-final replay 2006, SFC semi-final 2005, SFCB Final 2005. Tom was awarded the Leitrim Senior Referee of the Year accolade in 2006.

Tom is a former Ballinaglera club player having played as a dependable corner back from 1983 to 1997 and was captain of the team that won the JFCA title in 1992. He added an IFC medal in 1996. He is currently Chairman of the Ballinaglera Festival Committee and has served his Club as Cathaoirleach from 1996-98 and 2003-04 and as Rúnaí from 1993-95.

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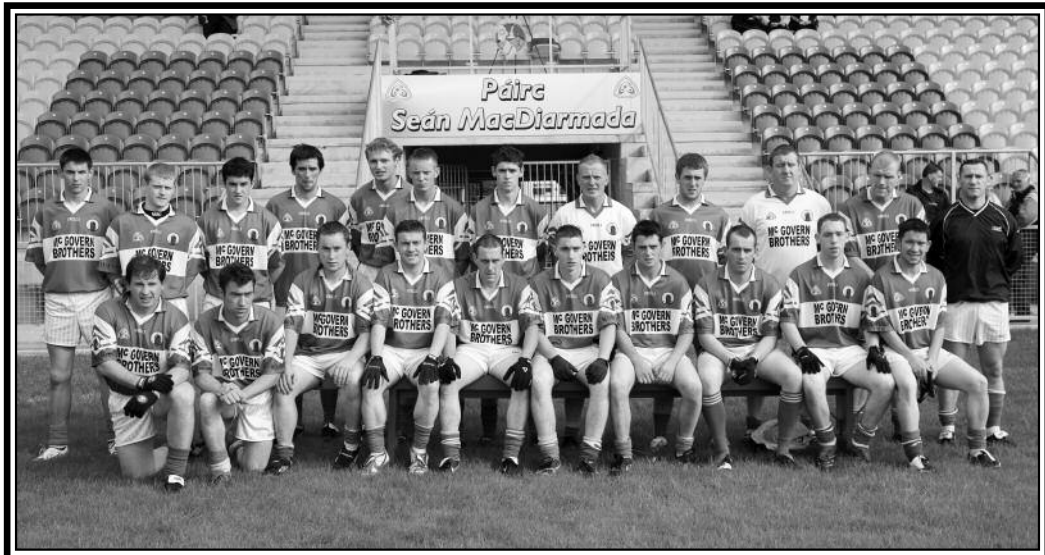

St Mary's Club History

The present day St. Mary's GAA club was re-formed in March 1944 at a meeting in the Town Hall, Carrick-on-Shannon. The following officers were elected:- Chairman: Fr. Bernie Keville R.I.P. Secretary: Brother Gabriel R.I.P. Treasurer: Brother Patrick R.I.P. Like most newly formed clubs St. Mary's had no home grounds and to overcome this obstacle they rented the Show Grounds on the Boyle Road at a cost of £15 per annum. For the next 55 years the club were to be synonymous with the promotion of Gaelic Games and cultural activities associated with the GAA in the parish of Kiltoghert.

Success came early to the club and in 1944 and 1945 they won two Junior Leagues. They also won the Junior Championship in 1945 as well as two Senior League Titles in 1946 and 1947.

The 1950's proved to be a very successful decade for the club winning three U-14 Championships ('57, '58, '59) two U-16 Championships ('58, and '59) one Minor Championship (1953), two Junior Championships ('53, and '56) and one Senior Championship in 1958. The 1958 Senior team was captained by present club stalwart George O'Toole. The club also captured three Junior League titles in this decade.

During the 1960's championship honours were scarce on the football scene. Our only championship success came at U-14 level in 1961, U-16 in 1962 and minor in 1965. We also won Senior League honours in 1964 and Minor League honours in 1960 and 1962. The club was represented on the 1962 Junior team which won the Connacht Junior Championship by Des Cox, Tommy O'Riordan, Conor Keaney and Paddy Guckian.

During the 1970's the club won a Junior Championship (1978) two U-16 Championships ('78 and '79) four U-14 Championships (70, '71, '76 and '77) two U-12 Championships ('73 and '78) and Senior League honours in 1976. It was also the decade when our first Scór success came to the club in 1971 with Tom Fitzgerald winning an All-Ireland title in the Recitation category. It was also the year that club member George O'Toole was elected chairman of the Leitrim Co. Board. In

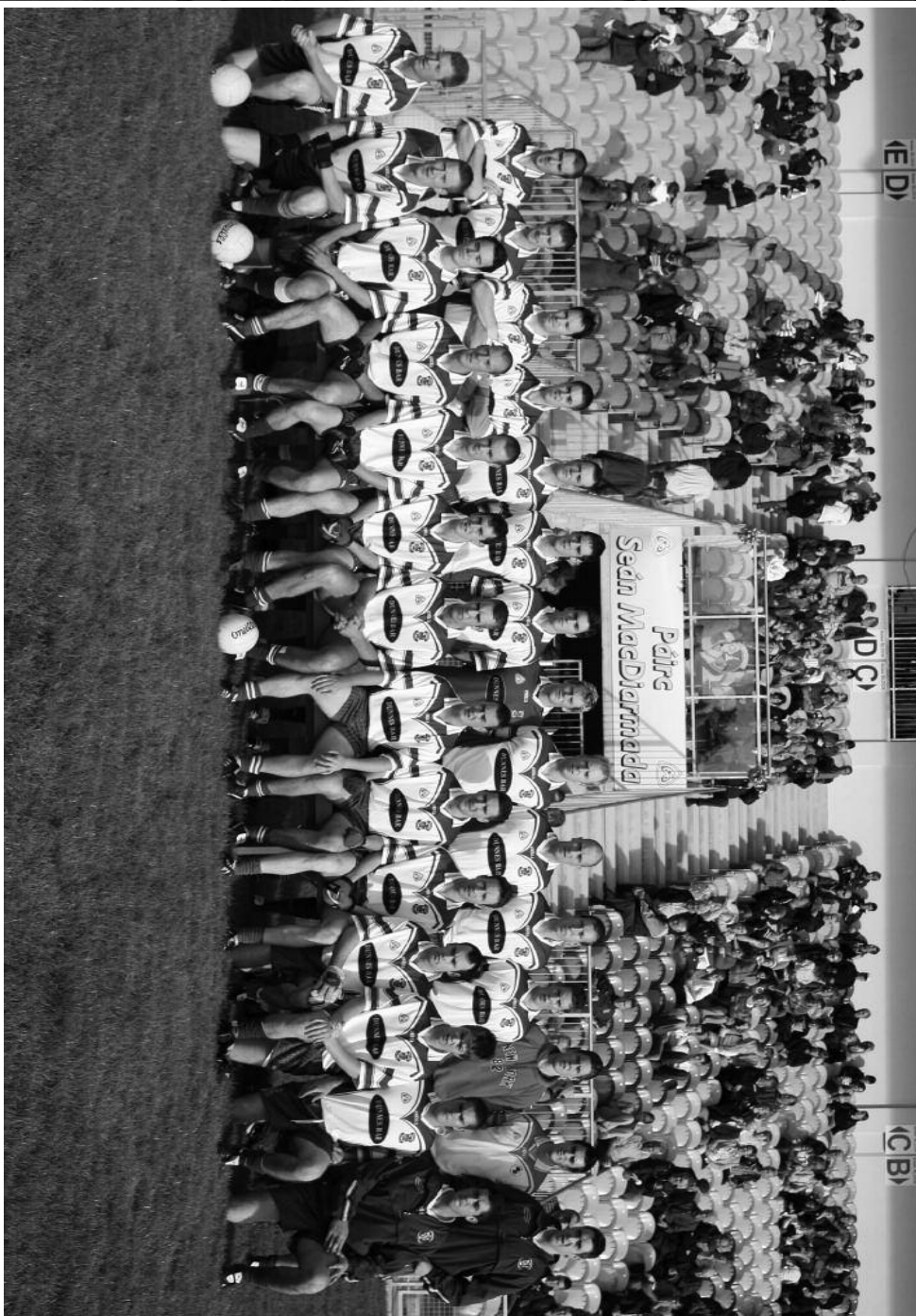
1974 after serving four years as Secretary of Leitrim Bórd na nÓg club stalwart Seán Murray was elected Chairman of Bórd na nÓg. The 1970's heralded the arrival of the great Michael Martin on the County scene and his endeavors were rewarded in 1974 when he was awarded County Player of the year and a replacement All-Star in 1977.

The eighties were a very successful decade for the club in Scór. Four Connacht titles were amassed – Ballad Group (3) and Novelty Act (1). Ballad group members were Elizabeth O'Halloran, Deirdre Holmes, Sean Neenan, Joe Flynn, Susan Weeks, Joe Moore, Walter Harman, Anne Jennings, Gerard O'Halloran and Siobhan Finnegan. Novelty Act members were Billy Gilligan, Michael Oates, Seán Murray and Geraldine Denny.

On the football scene 1988 was the highlight of the decade with the club winning U-12, U-14, U-16, Minor, U-21 and Junior B Championships. The nineties was a very exciting decade for the club on the football scene. The Senior, Intermediate and Minor championship wins of 1995 and the performance of the senior team in the Connacht Club Championship will be treasured. It was also the decade that saw Michael Martin win that elusive Senior Championship medal as a St. Mary's club member.

Since the turn of the Century St. Mary's has won a third Senior title in 2003, under the management of Noel Crossan. It also has a Club house, second set of dressing rooms and pitch on the Castlecarrara road and also provides space for the first Gael Scoil in Leitrim. Trojan work by Tom Guckian and Francie Bohan enabled us to fulfill our dream of these facilities.

Present day officers include Robert Mulvey - Chairman, Micheal Doherty - Secretary, Sean McGolderick - Treasurar and Caroline Conway - PRO. Barry Singleton and Seamus Reilly look after underage affairs. Club member Attracta O'Reilly is the current Coiste na nÓg Secretary and the club is very proud of the enormous work she undertakes in filling that role. Most of the above details are taken from an article submitted by Former Club Secretary Francie Bohan to a book Kiltoghert Towards the Millennium printed in 1999.

The GAA Fun Do Pack contains a state-of-the-art interactive DVD, which combines the latest technology with a practical resource that will make it user-friendly to even the least techno-minded individual.

"We wanted a Resource Pack for people who are coaching kids," explains Pat Daly, Director of GAA Games. "There are over four hours of top class video footage on the DVD-ROM. This footage is integrated with over 1,000 activities between Hurling and Football all of which are complemented by a series of written manuals."

"We differentiated between the kids at nursery level right through to sixth class so this is programmed for kids from the start right up to the end of primary school, whether they were within schools or clubs."

"In a nursery context, we set out a generic programme that will provide the underpinning basic motor skills which will enable the kids to move onto the sports specific skills. Then in the sports specific skills we broke it down into under-8s, under-10s, under-12s. In addition to the actual skills we then provide key tips surrounding games because this is all pitched in the context of 'Play and Stay with the GAA'."

"Kids want to play a game and the game has to be appropriate to childhood needs. It is also essential that children acquire the basic skills of Hurling and Football be they technical, tactical, team-play - in the most spontaneous and enjoyable manner possible. In the final analysis, 'tosach mhaith leath na h'oibre' - 'A good start is half the job'"

Each GAA Fun Do Learning Resource Pack is tailored for either Gaelic Football or Hurling. In total each resource pack contains an interactive DV-ROM, a Skills DVD, a Nursery DVD in addition to supplementary manuals on, GAA Go Games, catch and kick Coaching Classes or lift and strike Coaching Classes, a Coach Handbook and a Nursery Manual.
