# **Annaduff Club History**

The GAA came to Annaduff in 1899, as it did throughout Leitrim. Two clubs came into existence, Annaduff Parnellites in the centre of the parish and Drumsna Connaught Rangers, centred around the village. The Parnellites changed their name after the Parnellite split and became the Young Allen's, in honour of the youngest of the three Manchester Martyrs. Neither club had any great success in those early days.

The history of Gaelic Football in Annaduff was something of a hit and miss affair for first part of the twentieth century with the Club going in and out of existence several times, due to emigration and falling player numbers.

However, there were several highlights during those years, principally the winning of the Leitrim Senior Championship in 1928. That team had several stars, including John "Nipper" Shanley, and Peter Masterson, who were both on the Leitrim team which won the Connacht Championship for the first time in 1927.

The next high point came with the reformation of the Club in 1938. A mini golden age ensued, with two Junior crowns in 1938 and again in 1941. At this stage Club teams were playing in red and white. Players such as Paddy Butsy Faughnan, Tom Kiernan, Walter Notley, George O'Toole and Gerry McManus were the mainstays of the Club.

In common with so many other clubs in rural Ireland, emigration again caused the club to go out of existence. It was not until 1958 that Annaduff again took its place on the playing fields of Leitrim. Wearing the now famed maroon and gold jerseys for the first time and inspired by the late great, Fr Sean Manning, Annaduff Juniors contested both League and Championship finals that year. But it was at underage that Annaduff really made it mark, winning the Under-14 crown in 1964, with a team captained by Eugene Cox. The first team won the Junior title, defeating Drumkeerin in the final. Annaduff were back in Senior football and went on the contest the Senior Final in 1966, only to lose to a star-studded Aughavas side.

Annaduff returned to the Junior ranks in 1970 and won the Junior Championship again in 1972, with a team containing players such as Tony Gannon, Jim McGarry, Josie McManus, Jimmy O'Connor and young up and coming stars like Terry McGuinness and Tim Shanley.

But it was the Minors on 1971 which were the toast of the Club winning the County title in 1971. Little was expected from this team, but lead by Gerry McGarry, Terry McGuinness, Padraig Lynch and Tim and Frank Shanley, they defeated a strong Dromahaire side in the final. That year was also marked by the victory on Eamonn Shanley's under-14's who also took county honours. Two years later, that same team, with stars like Micheal and Lar Lynch, Ken McManus, Maurice Shanley and Gerard Moran, captured the Under-16 crown.

Annaduff then entered a valley period, during which no success came our way. However, it was marked by the fact that the Club made the courageous decision to purchase the park. The new ground, was opened in 1983 and nameed after Stanley Cox who had done so much to ensure that Annaduff had a worthy home.

The players responded with winning the Junior crown. Captained by Ken McManus, the team defeated Aughnasheelin in the County Final. We were Junior Champions again in 1986, with a team captained by Gerry Flanagan.

Annaduff kicked off the 21st century by, winning the Intermediate Championship and League in 2001. James Faughnan was the captain of this team, and three years later Annaduff entered the Promised Land winning the Senior Championship for the first time since 1928. Under the captaincy of Kevin Ludlow, Annaduff also took the Senior League crown, the Junior Championship and the Division Four League – the most successful year in the Club's history. This decade also Annaduff took several underage titles and many wins at second and third team level.

The opening years of the current decade saw us contesting 2 senior championship semi finals and losing a league final before taking the Division 1 league title in 2011. In 2016 we opened our Paddy Fox Training Pitch and 2018 finds us attempting to bounce back to senior championship at our first attempt having already gained promotion back to division one of the league this season. Our underage structure has never been stronger both in terms of numbers and development and we look forward to a bright future.



# Fenagh St Caillin's GAA History

Fenagh or St. Caillins may well have the honour of being the 1st registered club in Leitrim on the 1st October 1888. The early days saw a number of county titles with the last senior title coming in 1932. Like most rural clubs lean years were to follow with sporadic honours coming at various levels.

The 70s saw a rich vein of talent come through and together with our neighbours Kiltubrid won Junior and Intermediate Championships in 1973 and 1974. The latter year also saw Sheemore Gaels, an amalgamation of the then Fenagh and Carrick Intermediate teams win the Fenagh Cup, the last amalgamation to do so.

Beaten county finalists in 1981, it wasn't until the 1990s and early 2000s that we saw probably Fenagh's best ever adult team. Three heartbreaking losses in county finals in 1995, 1999, and 2003 earned the club the mantle of one of the best club teams not to achieve the ultimate reward. However Div.1 Senior League titles were won in 1999 and 2001.

Since 2000 with an invigorating underage programme the club has bucked current trends for rural parishes and competed at the highest grades in all underage competitions. As a result of those efforts some of the players lining out today have U12, U14, U16, Minor and U21 15 a-side championship medals. The introduction of these new young players has seen Fenagh promoted to Div. 1 of the League 2 years ago and also competing for honours in that division this year.

When Ladies football started in Leitrim in the 1970s, Fenagh ladies were to the fore. The 1980s were the club's glory years culminating in 3 in a row senior titles in 1987. Nowadays the club has teams at all grades and has won numerous underage titles. Two years ago the club won the Ladies Junior A Title. Lack of numbers does not diminish the enthusiasm of our ladies and they are an integral part of our club.

Handball has always had a strong tradition in Fenagh and now the club boasts of probably the best facilities in the county if not in Connaught. A recently completed 40 by 20 alley to complement the existing 60 by 40 alley means we have great facilities at our disposal. County, provincial and national titles have been won by the club with pride of place going to Donal Wrynn's All Ireland Minor singles title in 2012. Numerous other players lining out today have had success on the handball alley.

The club's appearance in the Intermediate County Final today is we hope the beginning of a new era for our club and just reward for all the hard work of parents, trainers, club officers and sponsors. We look forward to an enjoyable game and hopefully another historic day for the parish of Fenagh.

# PART OF THE GREAT GAA FAMILY

It reflects well on the GAA, at every level, that past teams are not forgotten and are annually woven into the fabric of Association events. This is happening today, as the Ballinamore three-in-a-row champion teams of 1967, '68 and '69 will be remembered and honoured, as Jubilee Guests on County Final Day. A very fitting gesture by Coiste Chontae Liatroma, out of respect for what the players, their families, their club and their supporters have contributed to our games and activities over the decades.

The club kingpins in Leitrim in the sixties were Melvin Gaels, Aughavas, Ballinamore, Carrick, Gortletteragh, Aughnasheelin, Annaduff and Cloone, so both league and championships were keenly contested amidst intense rivalry. Different grades also had their share of objections, counter-objections, appeals, suspensions, walkovers and what have you, so there was no scarcity of spice to add to the mix. Coming out on top of the championship pile was not easily achieved, nor is it ever, as every Gaelic player very well knows.



In the county semi-finals of 1967, Ballinamore got the better of Gortletteragh, while Melvin Gaels defeated the reigning champions, Aughavas. The scene was set for a thrilling final, with Tommy O'Riordan, County Secretary, as referee. It had the biggest crowd to date, with 1,350 paying a total of 197 quid at the gate. But the game itself never sparked, except when Michael Martin Jinked past Jackie Gallagher for an opportunist goal. The Fenagh Cup, which had been presented for the first time the previous year, was absent for the celebrations; Aughavas had forgotten, or omitted, to return it in time. But Ballinamore didn't mind, they were champions. Sergeant O'Donnell had the band ready to parade the town, after the customary victory bonfire at Edentenny. Due to the late conclusion of the various county senior finals in the province, Connacht Council decided not to proceed with the provincial club championship that year.

The Leitrim Observer struck gold for itself and for the county's clubs in 1967, by introducing Sean Murray as their GAA correspondent, "MoS". Sean would go on over the decades to co-ordinate increased coverage of games that our local paper continues to do weekly, with such an extensive GAA and Sports section from journalists who are in the know of what it means to the county.

Fr Doyle, a man whose integrity and sense of fair play was admired by all, retired as County Board Chairman at the '68 Convention and was succeeded by Fr Eugene Cox, whose brother Stanley would later become County Secretary. Ballinamore saw off Fenagh by 5-12 to 1-7 in the first round of the championship; then had a much closer call against neighbours, Aughnasheelin, 3-3 to 1-5; before beating Gortletteragh 1-11 to 0-6, to set up another final against Melvin Gaels. Despite the presence of so many county players on both sides, it was a disappointing game, with the holders retaining the Fenagh Cup (it had arrived from Aughavas earlier in the year), by 2-6 to 1-4.

It would be many months later before the Connacht Club Championship was held for the 1967 winners. Ballinamore had a great win over North Mayo at home, thus becoming the first club from the county to reach the Connacht Final, but lost out to Castlerea St Kevin's by 3-7 to 1-7.

Tournaments were becoming sort of mini-championships in the late 1960's and Ballinamore Festival had no less than 19 teams from Leitrim, Longford, Mayo, Cavan, Sligo, Monaghan and Fermanagh vying for the Gael Linn gold medals. Of course our club competed in tournaments in other counties, probably with the dual purpose of meeting top class teams, while also having an important social element.

But the bonding session to top all bonding sessions was late in 1968, when Ballinamore visited Gaelic Park, Connecticut and Boston, displaying their footballing talents in front of thousands of Leitrim and other Irish emigrants.

On the June Bank Holiday weekend, 1969, Ballinamore accepted an invitation to travel to Leeds, together with the St Ciallian club from Dublin, to play in a tournament organised by the Young Ireland GAA Club, of which Fenagh native Charlie Beirne was long-time Chairman. Ballinamore arrived home with the cup, hoping that it was a good omen for later in the year.

The Courthouse Wall, the Roman forum of Ballinamore, the debating location for all GAA matters, the gathering point prior to away games, the after-match studio, was demolished and gradually turned to dust, obliterating a lifetime of memories. But around the town the banter continued, especially with the club to meet Aughnasheelin in the championship, two teams that had very close encounters in league meetings. The champions survived and both Ballinamore and Aughavas defeated the North Leitrim finalists, Sean Tracey's and Melvin Gaels, by 5-8 to 0-6 and 0-10 to 0-3, respectively, to qualify for the county final.

Aughavas had their own sort of "Newbridge or Nowhere" moment, when they stated they would not play, unless the game was fixed for Gortletteragh. After the usual ding dong debate, Ballinamore agreed and JP Newton was appointed referee. Ballinamore prevailed on a 1-11 to 2-5 scoreline. The-three-in-a row was then a reality and it was a very happy Paddy Dolan who accepted the Fenagh Cup from County Chairman, Fr Eugene Cox. The attendance was 1,600, with a gate of two hundred and twenty two pounds.

The convoy beeped all the way back to the Edentenny bonfire, to the lorry waiting at the convent and then all around the town. We were now poised for another tilt at the Connacht Club, which was not played until June 1970. Against a very strong Castlebar Mitchels side, we lost out by 1-11 to 2-5.

There were still hopes for a fourth championship on the run, but Gortletteragh put paid to that in 1970. Still, three-in-row is something special to remember.

# **Aughawillan Club History**

Aughawillan GAA Club can proudly trace it's football heritage right back to 1889, when the first County Board in Leitrim was established, and Lower Drumreilly as it was then known took part as one of twenty four teams in the first County Championship in Leitrim in 1890. Aughawillan GAA grounds are based in Stroke, and the club draws members from the parishes of Corraleehan and Aughawillan.

The Aughawillan Senior team between 1980 and 1994 had a golden era, which very few clubs can match in terms of success. In those 14 years, the senior team were in 13 consecutive League Finals from 1980 to 1992, losing eight and winning five. They appeared in ten Senior Championship Finals winning in 1983, 1984, 1989, and winning three in a row in 1992, 1993 and 1994. They also reached two Senior Connacht Club Finals in 1992 and 1994.

In 2014, twenty years in the making Aughawillan stepped out of "The Group of Death" and again rose to great heights as they won the Senior Championship title. Aughawillan continued this success in 2014, reaching the Semi-Final of the Connacht Club Championship.

In 2016, the Aughawillan senior team unrelenting in their determination to be noted in the history books won their second Senior Championship title in three years.

Aughawillan has won eleven Senior Championships titles in 1923, 1976, 1978, 1983, 1984, 1989, 1992, 1993, 1994, 2014 and 2016.

Aughawillan as a small rural club, with dwindling numbers in the Community were forced to amalgamate at underage with neighbouring parishes in order to ensure that football was sustained and has seen success becoming the Leitrim Minor Champions in 2007 and 2008 as Garadice Gaels, U21 County winners in 2013 and 2015 as St Brigid's and U16 Champions in 2013 and 2016 as St Brigid's. These accolades at underage are credited to be the senior players we see representing our Aughawillan team in 2018 at the Senior Championship final.

A noteworthy feature of Aughawillan GAA Club is the continued hard work and perseverance of underage mentors to ensure that the club is kept alive with young blood learning the traditions of the GAA and pride in one's team, club and area.

Aughawillan GAA grounds have continued to be developed through the years and the community can be proud of the new Dressing Rooms, Gym, Club rooms, Training Pitch and Handball Court which have been added to our football club. An upcoming feature in our GAA grounds is the upgrading of the Gym, Strength and Conditioning Room and the addition of a Playground in order to ensure that family and community are always at the heart of the club.

In 2018, we now have an emerging team of talented and determined young men who wish to continue the success of recent years. We wish them success and wish to thank our community at home and abroad who have supported Aughawillan GAA throughout the years.



#### **Mohill Club History**





#### The late Jim Meehan, Station Road, Dromahair, St Patrick's Dromahair GAA Club and Leitrim GAA

The death occurred on October 3nd last of Assistant Treasurer of Leitrim GAA Jim Meehan, Station Road, Dromahair, after an illness bravely borne. The Dromahair native was one of the hardest workers behind the scenes of Leitrim GAA over a number of decades and his passing will be deeply felt by all that knew him and they were many across the county, province and indeed in national circles. He was an ever present at Leitrim matches, no matter where they took place and indeed his love of the GAA involved a constant involvement in the activities of his beloved Dromahair. A former player with Dromahair, Jim would have played through the 1970s and 1980s and was an accomplished goalkeeper with 1976 Junior Championship winning team. As his playing days came to a close he contributed to the officialdom of matches and served a term as a referee. He was also at hand to assist his club in coaching, as a selector and in managerial roles across



As a fund raiser extraordinaire for both club and county, it would be impossible to quantify the amount of money that Jim has raised for both organisations. It was no surprise, given his ability to fund raise that Jim was elected as Treasurer of Leitrim GAA for 2002. Over the following 6 years, Jim worked tirelessly on behalf of Leitrim GAA, an era which coincided with the development of the new stand at Páirc Seán Mac Diarmada and the purchase of the grounds that have since been developed into the Centre of Excellence. Jim's financial prudence contributed greatly towards the realisation of these projects which will serve Leitrim GAA over many generations.

Jim also combined his Leitrim GAA Treasury role with that of Connacht GAA and held both roles simultaneously over the period 2004-2006 which was a huge undertaking but one didn't faze him. Following his role as Treasurer with Leitrim GAA, Jim took on the role of Leitrim's Central Council delegate, a position he held from 2008-12. He returned to Connacht Council GAA as Leitrim's delegate following the conclusion of his five year Central Council term and represented Leitrim at provincial from 2013-17. Last December he became Assistant Treasurer of Leitrim GAA at its Annual Convention. Over many years Jim also took charge of the kitting out of county panels and was essentially the county's go-to man when county players' gear was required.

Away from the officialdom and the formality that such roles can require, Jim was a lifetime presence around the longest fundraising venture that Leitrim GAA has organised. The annual Supporters Club Draw, which has been on the go since 1986 has had Jim Meehan as one of its staunchest allies. It would be hard for people to appreciate the amount of time, effort and repetitive selling that Jim Meehan has put into this fundraiser over the best part of its existence. One image is quite clear, if you saw Jim reaching into the inside pocket of his jacket anytime from end of January towards the middle of March you could be sure that you were going to be relieved of the fee for the annual Supporters Club membership! It is a fact that possibly a majority of people feel less than comfortable selling tickets, Jim thrived on it and his hardy customers, and you can be assured they were many, gave willingly such was Jim's approach to the job. At the most recent Leitrim GAA Supporters Club Draw in March 2018, we were all delighted to see Jim present, despite his illness, to oversee the final instalment of this year's event. He was a constant member of the steering committee, holding various officer roles over many years in this fundraising drive. Suffice it to say, future Leitrim GAA Supporters Club fundraising will be at challenged to replace Jim's constant cajoling, drive and ultimately his selling power.

Away from the GAA, Jim was essentially a family man who found time, despite his many GAA commitments to operate a busy farm. He will be sorely missed by his wife Chrissie, who was his constant companion at all GAA events, sons Fergus, Kevin and Kieran. He will also be sadly missed by his sisters Kathleen, Della, Gay, Ena, Noeleen and Geroadine, daughters-in-law Patricia, Nicola and Sarah, grandchildren Amy, Thomas, Amelia, Aishling and Michael, relatives and friends. #### The late Shay Reynolds, Clooncolry, Dromod and Bornacoola GAA Club.

The death occurred on 16th of April last of Shay Reynolds, Clooncolry, Dromod, and late of Bornacoola GAA Club. The late Shay was many things to many people and gave of his all for the betterment of his community, parish and county and indeed beyond the county boundaries. As a member of Bornacoola Community Development, Dromod Development Association, Cloonmorris Graveyard Committee, to name but few, Shay was always to the fore in the promotion of all that is good within a community and among those organisations he will be sorely missed. Indeed Shay was also an avid follower of drama and starred in many productions in Cloonturk Hall many moons ago.



However it was in his beloved GAA that he left an indelible mark on all of us who were privileged to have shared his company. As Bornacoola GAA Club was dormant throughout the 1960s Shay played his earlier football with Annaduff GAA Club and indeed played in the County Senior Football Championship Final of 1966, with the Aughavas opposition of the day proving victorious. Shay managed to capture an elusive championship medal with his victorious Annaduff teammates in 1972 but with the return to the footballing fraternity of Bornacoola GAA Club in 1973, Shay transferred his allegiance back to his native parish, winning a Junior Football League Medal in 1976 and played in two Junior Championship Finals of 1976 and 1977 versus Drumreilly and Mohill respectively. With his playing career drawing to a close at this stage, Shay turned his hand to refereeing at which he was most adept. In 1980 he was the recipient of the Leitrim Referee of the Year Award.

As an administrator, Shay had few equals. He served the Executive of Leitrim GAA of that era as Registrar and also had a very keen interest in Scór, both as a participant and more recently as a Scór Officer. He served as Treasurer to the Connacht Scór Committee for many years in the late 1980's and into the 1990's and had many busy days at Provincial Scór Finals.

He served his club in many positions and held the position of Bornacoola GAA Club Chairman from 1989 to 2002, a fourteen year term during which the Bornacoola Club went from strength to strength on the playing fields with multiple underage successes as the club arrived to within grasp of a coveted Senior Championship title. Following his retirement as Chairman he was elected as Club President a position he held for the remainder of his days.

At county level, Shay was the ultimate supporter. Hail, rain or shine Shay travelled the length and breadth of the country to follow his beloved Leitrim. Many of those journeys were shared with his good friends and equally staunch Leitrim Supporters, TP Cox and the late Jimmy O Connor. While the result may not always have been favourable, the banter to and from those matches was bound to be priceless.

When the late Joe Flynn, Cathaoirleach Coiste Chontae Liatroma, was elected to office, one of his first appointments was Shay Reynolds as Chairman of the Leitrim Supporters Club. Shay threw himself with gusto into the role and presided over the Committee for the next six years. No effort was spared to ensure the success of the largest fundraising activity of Leitrim's calendar. Indeed after he had retired from the position as chair of the committee, Shay was still a huge driving force behind the operation and no later than March 10th last, he presided over the 2018 draw in Cox's Steakhouse, acting as MC on the night, with little sign of what, unfortunately, lay ahead.

Suffice it to say, Shay Reynolds was larger than life. He was excellent company in any company and many sing songs into the future will not be the same. 'The Rattling Bog' and 'It's a long way to Tipperary' will never really sound the same again and certainly when they are heard again in impromptu sing-alongs, memories of Shay will live on.



One of the great players, managers, committee members, and characters the GAA has ever seen, Paddy will forever be a legend, especially within the Leitrim hurling family.

It is hard to know where to begin when it comes to this legend and good friend of mine Paddy Phelan. Paddy was a stalwart, a hero and an inspiration. He encompassed everything that was right about the GAA. Paddy was widely regarded as a people person, always willing to give of his time. There are no words we can say here to do justice to the



Approximately 40 years ago, Paddy, Michael Dorrigan and I met and struck up a strong friendship based primarily around hurling which resulted in the three of us commencing hurling within the county. However, it must be said that without Paddy it would never have been the success it was. The three of us soldiered together and never was a bad word said between any of us. Unfortunately today the link has been broken with the loss of Paddy. Ironically, the last time Paddy saw his beloved Leitrim Senior Hurling team tog out in the green and gold was in Croke Park, the hallowed ground in June 2017 when the team reached the Lory Meagher Championship final. This occasion was the first ever time for a Leitrim Senior hurling team to reach Croke Park and what an occasion it was! How proud Paddy was that day watching lads he had coached from a very young age run out onto Croke Park to play in an All Ireland Final. All those days in Park Lane and travelling the county for matches with the bag of helmets, hurls and sliotars had finally come to fruition. I, for one, am delighted Paddy was there with me that day to experience such a maryellous occasion and to offer his constant positive support and guidance not only to me as manager but to every single player on the team. It is impossible to put into words what Paddy means to hurling in Leitrim and the void that has been left by his passing. We can, however, be grateful that his son, Hilary, has taken over from Paddy as Secretary of the Leitrim Hurling Board, while his grandson Liam is on the verge of breaking onto the Leitrim Senior Hurling team, which I know very well Paddy is very proud of.

Paddy's involvement in Leitrim GAA and Leitrim hurling, in particular, has been profound. Paddy has been involved on Connacht Council, representing Leitrim hurling, and has also been a member of the Leitrim GAA Executive for a long period of time. Most notably, Paddy has served as Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer on the Leitrim Hurling Board at different stages over the last 40 years. His work and commitment to all committees he has been involved in is an inspiration and his dedication has been second to none.

The last Leitrim Senior hurling game which Paddy played in was just 25 years ago when Leitrim were short a player against Sligo in a National Hurling League game. Of course, Paddy stood forward and said he would fill the place which he did. He grabbed the green and gold jersey without a word said and played the match. Not many people can say they had such a long hurling career as a player. This showed the character of Paddy as he would never let you down. Similarly, just last year when Paddy was receiving treatment in Galway, he would make sure that he would be home on time to go to training with me in Mullingar. He enjoyed those training sessions and the matches with the boys and the fun that was had.

Over his years involved in Leitrim and the time I have known Paddy, one thing I must say about him is that he never ever criticised a referee or a match official. At the end of a game and if luck wasn't on our side Paddy always said: "Ye had your chances". He was exactly spot on!

The memories of Paddy we have are endless and I am sure these memories will continue to be shared for a long time. Paddy brought such joy and happiness to so many people and his presence will be greatly missed. I will greatly miss Paddy's company going to training sessions and matches with the Leitrim hurling team along with his guidance and constant support. His passing is a huge blow to Leitrim Hurling while the passion he had for his home county and hurling, in general, is inspirational. As manager of the Leitrim Senior Hurling team, the biggest thing this team can do now is to go on and win a National Title in 2018 in Paddy's honour. And we will for Paddy!



#### **GAA** gets radical - time Leitrim followed suit

It is a lesson the clubs of Leitrim would be wise to heed!

Chatting to fans and players throughout this year's Club campaign, talk of revamping the Championships and Leagues of the County has never been more frequent. Some are already working hard on proposals to bring a more competitive product for clubs at a realistic standard. Some will argue the toss but there urgently needs to be a recognition that the system is simply not serving players, clubs and spectators well - just look at the results from this year's Senior and Intermediate Championship so far.

The average winning margin from 40 games at Senior level, including relegation games, is a staggering 9.1 points per game! In nobody's book is that competitive.

Delve into the figures a little deeper and we see that there were just eight games out of the 40 where the winning margin was three points or less. Far more worrying is the fact that 12 games decided by ten points or more with ten of those by 15 points or more.

Surely there is solace in the Intermediate Championship, traditionally the most competitive championship where all are evenly matched and everyone can win?

Statistically, yes it is but not by much - an average winning margin of 8.02 points per game can hardly be called competitive and of the 39 games so far, 14 were decided by three points or less, a big improvement on the Senior. But on the flip side, 14 games were decided by 10 points or more, again higher than the Senior grade!

And lest we be accused of cooking the figures - after all there are lies, damned lies and statistics - just two games before the final in the entire Junior A grade were won by six points or less with one drawn game!

Whatever about spectators, it can't be fun for players to endure these sort of games. And you have to question a system where teams are rewarded with a place in the quarter-finals despite losing more games than they have won!

And even using cold hard logic, how do we have 12 clubs competing in the Senior Championship when we had just 23 active clubs in 2018? Is the standard of football in Leitrim so much higher than everywhere else in Ireland?

It's easy to blame the County Board but it has been the clubs time and time again who have rejected the sort of reform needed to revitalise the club game in Leitrim. Despite overwhelming evidence that players were all in favour of League games without County players, Clubs almost rejected their that proposal only last December - after all, they're only players, what would they know!

It is time for players - the ones making the sacrifices yet enduring an antiquated system - to make themselves heard in each and every club and insist their voices be heard and that their Club insists on meaningful reform of Club structures in this county.

The evidence is right before our eyes so now is the time to draw up proposals and get working on a better, more competitive and far more enjoyable future for the Club player in Leitrim.
