Avantcard Páirc Seán MacDiarmada

1. Spectators are not permitted to bring alcohol into the ground.
2. The climbing of walls, stands or other buildings in the ground is forbidden.
3. Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any objects.
4. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play and shall be ejected.
5. Any person who remains in the gangway or aisle may be ejected from the ground.
6. Any person who fails to comply with instructions from a steward or member of the Gardai may be ejected from the ground.
7. The stadium management reserves the right of admission.
8. No smoking in Páirc Seán MacDiarmada except in designated areas.
9. Fireworks, smoke canisters, bottles, glasses, cans, flags, banners, poles, and other similar articles or containers, including anything which could or might be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the ground, and any person in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry or ejected from the ground.

Vincent McMorrow, referees his first Senior County Championship final today, another milestone in his very extensive GAA career. A member of the Glencar Manorhamilton Club in north Leitrim, Vincent has been refereeing for almost 25 years winning Bord na nÓg Referee of the Year in one of his first years in charge of the whistle.

Within the county he has taken charge of finals at every level including Intermediate and Junior Championships in addition to officiating at numerous Underage finals. On the intercounty circuit he has refereed at Connacht Junior Club Championship level and the Fr Manning Cup. Vincent also officiates at Ladies' football and has refereed at several Senior Championship and League Finals; he has also refereed at intercounty underage level.

Vincent played for his club Glencar Manor and won medals at Minor and Junior level. He has also managed the club Minor and U16 boys' teams and managed the club U12 and U14 girls' team to County Championship success.

Vincent is married to Mary, and they live in Pullboy Manorhamilton with their three children Dean, Elle and Darragh. Vincent works as a data analyst in the pensions department of the HSE. His umpires today are **Padraig Rooney, Gerry Boylan, John O'Flynn and Patrick Mc Morrow.**

Gareth Foley is from the Melvin Gaels Club in north Leitrim and has been refereeing for 17 years. Born in Manorhamilton in 1973 he is married to Christina and they have two daughters, Chloe and Saoirse. He is a carpenter/boatbuilder by trade and also runs a very successful family bus hire business.

He has won county league and championship medals at all underage grades with his club. In his long playing career he has had many medal successes including a Connacht minor league medal for Leitrim in 1991, and winning the intermediate league and championship in 1992, senior championship in 1998 and junior championship in 2011. He was Manager to the Melvin Gaels Minor teams who won the county championship in 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

Gareth also played for Leitrim for many years and reached Connacht championship finals in Under 18 in 1991, under 21 in 1994, senior in 2000 and junior in 2003. He was also part of the shield winning all Ireland masters team.

Gareth has refereed at all levels of football in Leitrim including ladies. To date he has officiated at championship finals at Under 12, 14, 16, 18, 21, junior, intermediate and the Senior final in 2021. He has been a member of the Connacht referring panel and the national support panel along with Ted Webb, Connacht minor and FBD Senior intercounty games. 21 years ago Gareth played in the senior final at wing halfback wearing the No 7 jersey and one of his umpires today, Joe Tiffoney, was at centre half back wearing No 6. In his own words it was a poor Melvin Gaels performance which saw Allen Gaels lift The Fenagh Cup.

This weekend he takes centre field with the whistle in his hand for the Minor final. His Umpires - Terry Tiffoney, Francis Mc Gloin, Joe Tiffoney and Paul Hamilton will be there to assist him along the way.

Based on the Facts

I have just finished reading a book called '**The Man Who Knew, The Life and Times of Alan Greenspan**' (the most important economic statesman of our time).



Alan was a maths prodigy who found a niche as a stats crunching consultant. In his early career his forensic analysis of factual information was the basis of all his decision making and advice to captains of industry and US presidents. With Greenspan in mind I decided to establish the facts behind Mohill and St Mary's paths to the final and if statistics mean anything, you should be able to predict today's winner. Each team played five matches.

Mohill	83	62	+21
St Mary's	82	36	+42

On the above metric alone St Mary's will win easily as they only conceded thirty six points, as against Mohill who conceded sixty two points, a staggering twenty six points difference.

However, against the top teams, they are a low scoring team. For instance St Marys scored 0-11 against Mohill in Round 4, 0-12 in the semi final against Ballinamore and in last year's county final 0-11 against Mohill. On the other hand, Mohill scored 2-13 against Glencar Manorhamilton in Round 3, 1-11 against St Mary's in Round 4 and 2-13 against Fenagh (after extra time) in the semi final. Mohill, on this evidence, have more scoring power.

In **Keith Beirne**, Mohill have without doubt the best forward in Leitrim football. His scoring achievements surpass the best forwards that Leitrim ever produced including **Packie McGarty, Cathal Flynn, Mickey Martin, Aidan Rooney**, and **Emlyn Mulligan**. In the five games to the final Keith Beirne scored fifty four points out of eighty three points, 65% of Mohill's total scores. St Mary's depend for scores from **Oisín Bohan, Ben Guckian, Paul Keaney** and **Jack Casey** with Oisín Bohan scoring 1-10 in four matches, (the scorers are not available for the Aughnasheelin match). So there you have the quantifiable data. Now who is going to win today?

Alan Greenspan discovered over his career that while the facts inform the decision-making process other factors come into play - like in a forthcoming presidential election when as chairman of the Federal Reserve, the president did not want him to increase interest rates just before an election. So what are the other factors influencing the outcome of today's match?

- Mohill had Keith Beirne last year and St Mary's still managed to beat them in the final;
- Mohill against Fenagh in the semi final went 0-7 to 0-2 up before fading out of the game completely, allowing Fenagh to take control. However, Mohill with all their experience, eventually won the game comprehensively in extra time.
- St Mary's (as the figures show) have the best defence in Leitrim.

So who is going to win?

- Should Mohill score two goals or more and keep Carrick goalless, Mohill will win.
- If Carrick can keep Keith Beirne scores to 1-4 (seven points) or less, Carrick will win.

This excellent and experienced Mohill team have lost finals in 2018 (Aughawillian), 2021 (Ballinamore Sean O Heslins) and 2022 (St Mary's Kiltoghert). They must be ravenous to win another title. As against that, St Mary's have never won back to back senior titles. Is this the year they will create their own little bit of club history?

I wonder what would Alan Greenspan say?

GOING FOR THE TWO IN A ROW

In 1973, over 30,000 spectators attended a Tennis match in the United States and at least 90 million watched it worldwide, making it the most viewed tennis event in history. Billie Jean King was up against Bobby Riggs in the famous Battle of the Sexes, with a prize fund of 100,000 dollars. Billie Jean ran away with the game, winning three sets 6 -4, 6 - 3 and 6 -3, whatever that means, and off she went with the hundred grand and became an icon for all women in sport. Maybe Vincent O'Rourke and the Leitrim CCC could put the County Board on the gravy train, if they got today's winners up against the lady champions. Better do it before the job on Páirc Seán starts.



Back in 1973, all Ballinamore were trying to do was win two in a row and bring the Fenagh Cup back to Ceannabo. Same as St Mary's today. No easy task, for the Mohill lads are champing at the bit.

No less than eleven of the Ballinamore panel of '73 are now in the great stadium in the sky -- the captain Michael Martin, Paddy Dolan, Harry O'Dowd, Hughie Smith, Francis Duignan, Peter Crossan, Noel Flynn, Thomas Galligan, Pádraig Flanagan, Tom O'Shea and Aiden Crossan. They all still live on in the memory of their families and the club and will be remembered in a special way today.

Even after 50 years those names still ring a bell in the mind's eye, as do the names of the others who lined out on that O'Heslin side -- Noel Crossan, Michael McTague, Brian McKiernan, Patsy Prior, Dermot Gannon, Joe Gormley, Tommy Spike McCormack, Gerry McIntyre, Paddy Friel, Sean Creamer, Killian McKiernan, Sean McGirl, Gay Prior, Walter Sharpley, Sean Sharpley, Joey Smith, Noel Duignan, Brendan Burns (who doubled up as Club Secretary) and Sean Kavanagh (who played a triple role as a defender, team trainer and Assistant Secretary) --- backroom teams hadn't been born half a century ago. Strength and conditioning was done in the hayfield, the bog or the building site, hamstrings hadn't been invented and who needed a team psychologist when 1927 team captain Tom Gannon was among the club Vice Presidents and Christy Gallogly held the whole show together as Chairman, with wise words -- and nicknames -- for everyone.

Páirc Seán, or "George's Field" as many called it, has seen changes too. It is now Avant Money Páirc Seán Mac Diarmada; the McGovern Stand, with its ultra modern facilities beneath, replaces the old grassy banks and the sardine-tin dressing rooms and press box; a lift, in memory of the late Leitrim footballer Seamus Dillon has been installed for the benefit of wheelchair users; the county final programme in full colour. Shane Butler or Hugh Galton, with a press of their thumbs, keeps us all informed of the score, while the fourth official flashes the green and red substitutions and even how long is left; there is even a side entrance and parking past the magnificent Naomh Muire club grounds; the gatemen have zappers to check your on-line admission tickets; the match is broadcast by Shannonside and Ocean FM, streamed and televised -- and today's final by TG4, the station so beloved by GAA fans for its all year round coverage of our games; there is a small army of hi-vis officials and stewards catering for our every need; you can have a hot cuppa and biscuits on your way in or at half time from the St Mary's club energetic workers; upstairs guests, stewards, officials and hangers-on like myself get the four star treatment from Maureen Diffley and the other caterers; mobile phones are relaying every kick of the ball through facebook, what's app, tik tok and Elon Musk's X to all parts of the globe; there are FIRS and MNAS in every corner of the ground, but best of all is the ever increasing numbers of women and children in the stand or on the sidelines, almost all of them, together with the men, kitted out in club jerseys, training tops or wet gear. GAA casual fashion is now big business.

But some things never change, whether it's 1973 or 2023, the build-up in the Observer, the Kiltubrid Pipe Band leading the parade, the banter from the supporters, the oohs and aahs and the shouts of ah ref and the emotion coming in waves, like the tide on the way in at Tullaghan Strand. Let us all enjoy the occasion, compliment Leitrim County Board on the magnificent arrangements, pay due tribute to all the players and let us spare a half time cheer for the Ballinamore team that took home the Fenagh Cup in 1973, on the day they were hoping for a two in a row.

Clubs deserve time in the sun too

Has there ever been anything better in the history of the Association than TG4's GAA Beo for prompting and spreading the gospel of the club game to the masses? It's an apt observation as the Irish language's station returns to Avant Money Páirc Seán Mac Diarmada for the second time in three years today for the meeting of Mohill and champions St Mary's Kiltoghert.



Two years ago, a classic encounter between Ballinamore Sean O'Heslins and Mohill that eventually went the way of Ballinamore, ending a 21 year famine, enthralled the nation, GAA fans the length and breadth of the country singing the praises of two club teams from Ireland's smallest county, population wise anyway, and leaving Leitrim basking in the warm glow of unaccustomed praise.

Truth be told, GAA Beo has been doing that for counties for so many years in both hurling and football that we've almost come to regard it as part of the furniture, something to plan on shortening autumn and winter afternoons as the club scene winds down all over the island.

Exploits of club players who may never have got the chance to shine in Croke Park with their county are suddenly front and centre and we remember just why the GAA remains the single most important association in every part of our small country. It is something we forget and this is not an ode to TG4 - the provincial press and local radio do the same in each and every one of the 32 counties, reporting on feats of daring do and excellence, lifting local heroes to new acclaim but none have the national reach of TG4 so that should be celebrated.

RTE have started showing club games in their Saturday evening slot, a welcome and long, long overdue recognition of the club game but still, some aren't happy. Traditionalists want the All-Irelands back in September and the club game back in its box, so to speak - I can't imagine any club games would have been televised in recent weeks had the past few weeks being dominated by the battle for Liam and Sam and as overpowering and all encompassing as the county game is, we forget that probably 99% of the GAA's players are club players and the rest, the county contingent, are club players too.

The Club game deserves its time in the sun, it should be celebrated and down the country, it is where newspapers, local radio and in recent years streaming services brings the game to a local audience.

I only bring it up because there seems to be a continual assault these days on the notion of the split season - particularly from those in the national media. I can't blame them, games in Leitrim won't sell many *Indos* or *Times* or *Examiners* in Cork, Dublin or Kerry but the split season has been a boon for players, club and county.

Any of them I've asked about it see nothing but positives - the idea that we're giving up promotional time to "other" sports by noting reverting to September All Irelands is frankly ridiculous because today, Leitrim County Final day, is the day that all those with Leitrim GAA in their blood cherish above all else. 2007 and 2008, Alan coached at Third Level with GMIT, his Freshers team reached the All Ireland final in 2007 and the Sigerson team reached the Semi final stage in 2008, both for the first time.

In 2009, Alan took over the Tuam Stars Senior team. After a long period away from the later stages of the senior championship, a new team was built, and in 2011 Tuam reached the Senior county final for the first time in 17 years, losing to Corofin in the final. In 2010, Alan joined Alan Mulholland and Donal O'Flaharta, as coach of the Galway U21's. In 2011 they won the All Ireland, beating Cavan in Croke Park. In 2013, Alan became the manager of the Galway U21s, winning the All Ireland U21 championship, their 2nd in 3 years, with his team beating Cork in the final played at the Gaelic Grounds in May 2013.

Over the last 10 years, Alan has coached 3 more Inter-County Senior teams, namely Clare, under Colm Collins, Kildare, under Cian O'Neill, and Offaly, under the late Liam Kearns RIP. Along with this he has managed and coached Tuam Stars senior team for a second term, Annaghdown, and Castlebar Mitchels.

Alan took over as Senior manager of St Mary's Kiltoghert, in January 2022. Alan is married to Fiona and they have two sons, Seamíe and Páidí. He is ably assisted by selectors - Gene Bohan and Damien Butler.

Gene Bohan has won championship medals at all underage levels, 3 senior championship, and 6 senior league. He captained Leitrim to Fr Manning success in 1990. Connacht Minor League 1991 and U21 Hastings Cup 1991 and has also managed championship wins at underage levels. Gene is married to Anne Louise and they have three sons, Oisín, Ethan & Senan.

Damien Butler is currently the Coaching Officer in the Club, as well as manager of St. Mary's Junior A team. He is the proud holder of Senior, Intermediate, Junior A, B and C championship medals. Damien is teacher in Lough Allen College in Drumkeeran where he is also manager of the Senior Boys and Senior Girls Teams. St Mary's Kiltoghert Club History

The present day St. Mary's GAA club was re-formed in March 1944 at a meeting in the Town Hall, Carrick on Shannon. The following officers were elected:

Chairman: Fr Bernie Keville R.I.P.

Secretary: Brother Gabriel R.I.P.

Treasurer: Brother Patrick R.I.P.

With no grounds of our own, we rented facilities at the Showground's on the Boyle road.

In 1965 the Club purchased land at Townspark, Carrick on Shannon and in the mid-80s developed Páirc Uí Chearnaigh, which has served the club very well down through the years. Due to increasing demands on our facilities, we purchased additional land at Attifinlay in 1996 and developed our present clubhouse and facilities which were opened in 2003. In 2010 we upgraded our facilities providing a training area and conditioning hill. With over 800 members in our club, we are currently looking to upgrade our existing facilities. We are hopeful that work will commence on this project very soon.

Over the years our club has had many great sporting feats - claiming six Senior Championship titles in 1958, 1995, 2003, 2007, 2013 and 2022, Intermediate titles in 1995, 1997, 2000 and 2004, numerous underage titles at all age levels whilst many of our members have been part of many successful days with Carrick Hurling over the years.

We also have a very successful ladies section in the club where we field teams at all levels and have won Jun B, Jun A, Intermediate Championships and now competing in the senior Ladies Championship. Over the years the ladies have also been successful in adult leagues and numerous underage titles and 2021 saw the formation of a "Mothers and Others" group who having taken part in many Blitz's over the past three years.

Scór has been an integral part of our club since the 70's. We have won Connacht titles in Ballad Group, Novelty Act, Figure Dancing and Junior Ballad Group and All Ireland titles in Recitation and most recently, our Junior Ballad Group in 2019. Our Senior Ballad Group had the honour of performing at half time in Croke Park for the All Ireland hurling semi-finals in 2016.

We have a strong tradition of members serving at executive level on Co Committee over the years and have always been supportive of all County Teams

With a very vibrant club with over 800 members involved in adult, ladies, and men's teams, underage teams, scór and many of our members also play with Carrick Hurling. Our underage structure is very active, with many of today's Senior panel involved in passing on their skills and assisting with coaching our underage teams. Carrick Area U10 Community Games teams have done very well over the last 10 years, winning County, Connacht and All Ireland titles, most notably Gold in 2011 and 2017, Silver in 2013 and bronze in 2010. It's no small coincidence that many of today's panellists were part of this success.

Today we wish our Minor & Senior teams and Management the very best of luck. Their commitment, dedication and passion are exemplary and all club members and supporters are extremely proud of them.

We also acknowledge all those who served our club with distinction, on and off the field over the years, which has helped us to be the club we are today.

We remember with fondness all our good club people who have passed away over the years. They have left a void in the club, never to be filled, but we know they are very much with us all today.

Once again may we take this opportunity to thank all our sponsors for their continued support and all those who continue to support us in every way. This support will ensure our club continues to thrive at the highest level.

30 year old **Shane Quinn** is our team captain and is in his first year as captain of the side. Shane is the son of Micheal and Claire Quinn. His brother Conor is also a member of today's Senior team with sister Emma playing for Mohill ladies. Shane works as a Technician for telecommunications company Eir. He has been an ever-present on Mohill's Senior team since his debut all the way back in 2010. A fantastic underage player, Shane played with Leitrim at all levels and showed early signs of his leadership capabilities captaining the County Minor team in 2011. It didn't take long for him to break onto the Inter County scene at Senior level as he made his debut with the Seniors following a successful stint with the County U21s reaching the Connacht Final in 2014. Over the past 10 years, he has been a constant on the County Senior team. A very versatile player, Shane has played everywhere from the half back line through to the half forward line putting in some fine performances along the way for club and county. Incredibly, alongside a few more of today's team, he plays in his 9th County Senior Final (including a replay in 2015) and will be hoping that he will be on Cloud 9 later on and has the honour of climbing the steps of Ardán MhicShamhráin to collect the Fenagh Cup for Mohill's 9th Senior title.

Eamonn O'Hara – Manager

This is Eamonn's second year in charge of the Mohill men losing out narrowly in last year's final to today's opposition, St Marys. A former Sligo All-Star and one of the greatest, Eamonn was one of the longest serving Gaelic footballers at senior county level. He began playing in 1994 and officially retired from inter-county football in 2013. Eamonn was named on the All Star team in 2002 and also represented Ireland twice in the International Rules Series. Eamonn won a Senior Connacht Championship medal in 2007 with Sligo, a game in which he

scored a famous goal against Galway. Eamonn won an incredible eight senior championships as a player with his club Tourlestrane. Eamonn then went on to co-manage his native Tourlestrane to five consecutive senior club championships in Sligo (2016-2020). He previously spent one season in charge of Mayo club Ballaghaderreen and was involved with the Sligo U20's. Eamonn will be hoping that he can capture the Fenagh cup today for Mohill and end the disappointment of losing out narrowly over the previous two years.

Ronan Gallagher (*Selector*) is in his first year as selector of Mohill Senior Team having soldiered alongside many of the today's panel picking up numerous Senior Leagues and Championships over the years. Ronan has represented Leitrim at all ages up to Senior Level. We would have to go all the way back to 2006 to a repeat of today's final between Mohill and St Marys when 20 year old Ronan put in a memorable performance hitting 0-3 to help Mohill bridge a 35 year gap to win the Fenagh Cup. Fast forward 9 years to 2015 when Ronan picked up the Man of the Match Award on County Final day in a last gasp replay win against Glencar/Manor. He picked up his 3rd Championship medal in 2017 playing at full back and his 4th in 2020 although missing the final through injury. Hopefully Ronan can emulate his success as a player in his role on the Mohill management team today.

Mickey Quinn (*Selector*) hails from Cloone GAA club, former Cloone and Leitrim midfielder. Mickey has been a selector with Mohill for the past five years and has given great commitment to Mohill teams. Mickey has represented Leitrim at every age level from underage to senior. Mickey managed both Mohill Ladies and the Mohill minors to a number of league and championship titles. Mickey's two sons Shane and Connor Quinn both feature for Mohill today and Mickey will be hoping to see Shane lift the Fenagh as the Mohill team captain.

Cian Mulrooney (*Strength and Conditioning Coach*) is another Sligo man that helps make up the Mohill team management. Cian is an expert in sports science and plays a pivotal role in this year's team fitness. Cian is a current football player with Sligo's, Enniscrone Gaa. Cian also has vast experience in athletics winning an all-Ireland silver medal in the u23, 5000m race. Cian was a coach with Sligos, Eoghan Rua Ladies team who won a Connacht junior Championship in 2020. He was also strength and conditioning coach with the Sligo u20 team who won the Connacht Championship in 2022.

Mohill GAA History

The Mohill Faugh a Ballagh Club was founded in rooms on Glebe St. on the 27th of January 1889; the first active club in Leitrim and going strong ever since. Mohill won the first ever Leitrim Senior Football Championship a year later in 1890. We again added Senior Championships in 1914 and 1929 but it was 42 years until we tasted success at Senior level again winning the 1971 Championship. We contested the 1972 and 1974 finals but it would be another 35 years before the Fenagh Cup would spend the winter in Mohill again. In a classic final in Páirc Naomh Mhuire, Cloone on the 8th of October 2006, we snatched victory in a dramatic finale coming from 5 points down with 8 minutes to go to win by one on a scoreline of 0-13 to 1-9; our fifth Senior Championship title.

In recent years, we have been lucky enough to reach the County Senior Final on seven occasions in ten seasons between 2013 and 2022. Today's final is our fourth appearance here on County Final day in a row. In 2015 we added our 6th Senior title beating Glencar-Manorhamilton in a replay and once again in dramatic circumstances. The man who had kicked the winning point in the 2006 final deep in injury was in the right place once again. The ball fell to Ronan Kennedy who made no mistake in despatching the ball to the net in one of the most dramatic finishes to a County Final in Leitrim football history with Mohill winning out 1-4 to 0-6.

We returned on Final Day in 2017 with Glencar-Manorhamilton the opponents once again. In a fantastic game which produced football of the highest standard, we were triumphant on a scoreline of 0-14 to 0-11. This day will always be remembered as club stalwart Mary Kennedy lifted the Fenagh Cup on behalf of our club on front of a joyous sea of supporters on the Pairc Seán pitch below. Sadly Mary passed to her eternal reward eight months later and she will be in all of our thoughts today in what would be such an important day for her. Our most recent success and our 8th Senior title came in 2020 when we defeated today's opponents St.Marys on a scoreline of 0-14 to 0-9 in a Championship played through Covid-19 which meant the attendance was limited to 200 people. A very different atmosphere to what we expect at today's final.

To add to our success at Senior level we have won 2 Intermediate, 6 Junior A, 6 Under 21, 12 Minor A and 13 Under 16 Championship titles. We have always been a prominent club at underage level in the county tasting a lot of success throughout the decades which contributed greatly to winning at senior level. The club has a very active Bórd na nÓg at present with coaches out every Saturday morning organising and attending blitzes for our U6's up to U11's. Great work is also being put in with our U13's, 15's and 17's as they compete well in every competition at a high level.

Today's final is a repeat of last year's final and the fifth meeting of the two clubs at this stage in this century which means they are no strangers to each other on County Final Day. Mohill took home the Fenagh Cup in 2006 and 2020 with St Marys taking the spoils in the 2013 and 2022 finals, which leaves it at two wins each. Both teams will be hoping to get one up on the other today to become the Leitrim Senior Champions for 2023. We wish the panel and management every success today. Fág a'bealach!

Páirc Philb Mhic Aonghusa

Football was first played at St Manchans GAA Park in the 1940's with many important county games being played there during the 40's and 50's. The pitch was closed in February 2010 for revamp and reopened in 2012. It was rededicated in memory of the late great Philly McGuinness who sadly passed away in April 2010. Philly played at full forward in the 2006 Senior final alongside brothers Michael and John in what was a historic day for our club.
